

Sunday, Oct. 23rd 1851

This morning at
about 7 am Mr. Tilling
of the San Consul at this
port came to me at the hotel
with word that his father
wished to see me at my
earliest convenience about
an interesting case of the Cons-
ulate School Mr. Tilling
Succeeded by the authorities of
the port & all apparently united
excited over some news from
the North side of the Island
to the effect that in last part
of people were buying & selling
on the North side of the Island
but on all of the heavy work
it was shown that it was
not flowing (anyway) & it
quite with rain at the time

as my vessel was the only one in the harbor at the time except the Sarah who was quite hauled up, no sailing requested us to go out to the Reserve of those poor people, probably some big sicked crew, went on board with the hotel found my dock library full of cards & ice-cream water taken on board the night before, got them down from shore, (as I had a lot of my bread on Liberty in store) turned the water and beer into the stove and chard the dock is really as far as I could get at 1.30 p.m. slipped with anchors

and put out under cover to
the sail & storm stay sail, after
passing the Head set back with
and small jib to hold up under
the Head. Lost jib & braced
fore sail, but found nothing
of the boat or crew at 10 A.M.
blowing very hard from N.
S. at midnight wind
moderated. Came back to our
anchors at 9 P.M. Oct. 24.
Night I had been fortunate
enough to have picked up
four fellows up but they
may yet be safe.

Oct. 29.

Took the anchors this morning and
put to sea. Picked up four men within
five or six shore feet. Lost a man at
Nagall by Description viz. Daniel Gray
the James Harris George Bonyell
Peter Adams James Nathan. Mr. Cook
Harris went either to Longfellow at Nagal
Harris. I intended to ball last weather
for 2 or 3 days but to note over oil for
the sun at all takes up time.

Sept. 18

Mediant winds, d. b. Big passing
Strong between two hills a gravel
bandier. Becke cut for provision
this morning & and found no air
14. bar. Short halled up for house

at 8 am took the boat & pulled
in to the harbor and after
tying in our anchor & or 2
hours was permitted to land
get a bar of Capt. Robert
of Schooner & to go in and
look at Capt. Allen Cook
Marshall with brought the
ship to anchor sent the back

18.11.

Took of the park, Discharged
Mr. Walstead took the anchors
Went to see Miss. C. H. & wife

Mar 19

14. touched at head of far side,
North. Camp trailer
striped car moved to grass second
camp.

1820

Second Mate backed out
stripped another, & came on board
at dusk got 4 dogs & 3 or 4 turns
dipped the rig away to the S. side
left the Hope other left
Borden leaving off 9. or

101 11 11

Call all hands at 5 o'clock
this morning to get the last
stream & turn the big abutment
bolts with the heavy roller.
