

June 3rd 1882

Breeze, Breeze, S.W. at 4 p.m. spoke the bark *Sutton* of New Bedford Capt. White 30 days out. Clear wind in land heard some news from home

Long 48° 39'

June 4th

Shine weather see and squall about every day but cannot fall in with the fish that cut it. Lent cold water topsail
Lat 32° 30'

June 5th Shine weather gained with the tutor

June 6th Shine put down the fore top gale and yard tattered up the bands
Lat 31° 32'
Long 48° 05' W

June 12th Brig working to the N.W.
Lat 35° 15' W
Long 49° 36' W

June 13th fine weather saw many finback & subphalottans whales.
Lat 37° 11' W
Long 49° 47' W

June 14th Shine S.E. weather
Lat 38° 34' W
Long 49° 10' W

June 15th Shine strong weather saw black fish & porpoise
Lat 39° 43' W
Long 49° 14' W

June 16th Shine weather Winds E - picked up one bar petroleum oil
Lat 39° 40' W
Long 49° 15' W

June 18th Strong southerly winds with some rain
Lat 38° 56' W
Long 47° 43' W

June 19th Light air & Calms, some rain
Lat 38° 12' W
Long 47° 20' W

June 20th Light air & Calms picked up a bar. petroleum oil
Lat 38° 07' W
Long 47° 05' W

June 21st

Calms at 4:30 am John fish rose sperm whales going in. S.W. got breakfast and lowered the boats. at 10 am rose the whale from the boats at 12 got a light N.E. air set the boat sails at 4 p.m. S.W. struck one of three large whales brig about 25 miles to the S.W. turned the whale up and left him with the other two boats & started to find the ship got on land at 5:30 p.m. light air from S.W. brig working up under all sail
Lat 38° 00' Long 46° 11'

June 22nd at 3 a.m. rose the boat lights under light at S.W. sent away S.W. to help find the whale took him to ship at 10 am. got breakfast & hooked on & cut fins the body & turned in all hands. Weather fine.

June 23rd fins cutting and started to coil weather fine
Lat 37° 17' W
Long 45° 11' W

June 24th heavy rain cool down. Gotter port closed up started the work.
June 25th strong S.W. got brig ready to go.
Lat 37° 25' W
Long 45° 43' W

June 26th S.W. gale, strong N.E. current

June 27th Strong gale S.W. fin coiling and stowing down
95 lbs, Lat 39° 00' S, 44° 57' W

June 28th Strong winds from S.W.
Lat 39° 10' 44° 51'

June 29th S.W. gale, with very strong N.E. current ship heading S. under all possible sail & making on E.S. course. M.W. making N. course.

June 30th Moderate S.W. gale Lat 39° 35' Long 44° 22'

July 1st Moderate gale S.W. high barometer. Ship head south in hope to get south of the current Lat 36° 35' 42° 08'
