

Log of "Bark Mattapoisett" of New

Friday Sept 10th

Commences with light winds and calms steering different courses to the Sward of Pico. Middle and latter parts the same. So ends

Saturday Sept 11th

Commences with moderate breeze from the E ward cruising on different tacks to the Sward of Pico under all sail at 4 P.M. Captain went ashore at Callietta. Boat returned at 11 P.M. ship laying off & on. latter part light dews from different quarters working to the W ward under all sail

Sunday Sept 12th

Commences with fresh breeze from the W ward. by the wind on different tacks under all prudent sail. middle part working up under easy sail. latter part light airs from different quarters. working towards Fayal under all sail

Monday Sept 13th

Commences with fresh breeze from the S.E. ward. ship by the wind to the S ward. under all prudent sail. Fayal at 4 P.M. bearing S.W. distant 10 miles middle and latter parts working up towards the harbour. So ends.

Tuesday Sept 14th

Commences with moderate breeze from the S ward. at 1.30 P.M. dropped anchor at Fayal. and lay with 75 fathoms of cable & took a salvage anchor with 90 fathoms cable employed breaking out shooks and oil had two men from ashore working

Wednesday Sept 15th

Lying at anchor in Fayal employed breaking out oil. sent ashore shooks and hudds etc for 20 casks. had one man from ashore working

Thursday Sept 16th

Lying at anchor in Fayal employed in breaking out ships hold sent ashore for shipment 11 casks of sperm oil marked ~~MD~~ and numbered from one to eleven. had a cooper and his mate and one man off working

Friday Sept 17th

Lying at anchor in Fayal employed in breaking out oil and stowing water. had a cooper & his mate and one man off working.

Saturday Sept 18th

Lying at anchor at Fayal employed breaking out oil & stowing water. sent ashore 14 casks of sperm oil marked ~~MD~~ and numbered from 12 to 25. had a cooper & his mate and one man off working

Sunday Sept 19th

Lying at anchor in Fayal. give all hands a run ashore
