Wednesday Oct 20th

Wm Inland this day commenced with moderate breeze from S & W at 12 M strong breeze from same quarter respect the topsails and furled it saw two sails and the land employed in breaking out pork and dried apples Lat 33.23 N Long 17.58 W

Thursday the 21st Oct

raining and squally last night at 3 A M wind hauled to the W more ship heading S by W today strong breeze from same quarter under double reefed topsails and courses saw two sails employed in making and taking in sail Lat 33.14 N Long 18.58 W

Friday Oct 22nd

Moore wind moderating last night today wind to the S W ship in starboard tack under topsails saw the island of Madeira employed in various odd jobs sunset reefed topsails Lat 32.15 N Long 17.20 W

Saturday Oct 23rd

light breeze last night today stiff breeze from the S W to S W and thick saw two sails employed in ship duty sunset heading S the Westward under topsails & courses

Sunday Oct 24th

calm last night until 12 M light breeze from S & E heading S W under topsails saw nothing during the same sunset calm

Monday Oct 25th

at 4 P M last night light breeze from S & E heading S W today the same at 2 P M wind to the Westward steering S by E saw two sails and sulphur bottoms so ends Lat 30.30 N Long 12.44 W

Tuesday Oct 26th

calm all night today light breeze from S by W steering S by E under all sail saw the island of Palma employed in breaking out water scraping masts and washing ship inside Palma Lat 28.55 N Long 17.23 W

Wednesday Oct 27th

light breeze all night and air through the day from S by W saw the islands of Palma and Genireiff employed in breaking out mules bent the new mainsail at 4 P M covered the W & L Boats for practice sunset Genireiff bearing S & E thirty five miles distant

Thursday Oct 28th

calm all night and today saw the islands of Palma Genireiff and Grand Canarie employed in mending foresail and bent it again Lat 28.58 S Long

Friday Oct 29th

calm all night and today sails cleared down at 4 P M made sail with cuts passed from the Eastward saw two sails and the land employed in working ship outside

Saturday Oct 30th

cats passed all night today light breeze from the Eastward going tack and tack saw seven sails employed in ship duty at 4 P M got up cables and anchors ready sunset heading off shore

Sunday Oct 31st

light breeze from the Eastward came to anchor at Santa Cruz at 10.30 A M in 7 fathoms under sails the Mermaid came to anchor at 11.30 A M the Morning Star, Seine and President 2nd on shore and four Scho and the Varisca so ends
