Thursday March 3<sup>rd</sup>  
moderate breeze from the E S E  
steering N E saw one sail employed  
in making new main tacks  
No Observations

Friday March 4<sup>th</sup>  
light airs from the S E ward  
steering N E saw porpoises and one  
sail employed in heading out the hole  
and filling with salt water 4 P M  
raining  
Lat 1.48 S  
Long 28.43 W

Saturday March 5<sup>th</sup>  
light airs from the S E steering  
N E saw grampus and one sail and  
one steamer employed in breaking out and  
filling with salt water finished, killed  
a pig &c  
Lat 1.55 S  
Long 28.19 W

Sunday March 6<sup>th</sup>  
more light airs and calms heading to the  
returned N Ward saw porpoises one sail and one  
w duty steamer  
Lat 00 24 S  
Long 28.33 W

Monday March 7<sup>th</sup>  
calms and light airs from the E ward  
saw grampus porpoises and three sails  
two bound south and one northward  
Lat 00 01 S  
Long 28.44 W

Tuesday March 8<sup>th</sup>  
light airs from the E ward steering N N E  
saw porpoises one sail and at 9 P M the rocks  
of St Pauls employed in various jobs at sunset  
St Pauls the rocks bearing N of compass 12 miles distant  
bore on some  
Lat 00 40 N  
Long 29 03 W

Wednesday March 9<sup>th</sup>  
calms and light airs from the N E heading  
N N W laid by for the rocks last night  
today lost sight of them at 11 A M employed  
in various odd jobs Lat 00 52 N  
guess Long 29 41 W

Thursday March 10<sup>th</sup>  
light breezes from N E heading to the N N W  
ward saw one steamer bound to the S W  
ward employed in painting blocks and  
rounds &c Lat 1.43 N  
Long 31.08 W

Friday March 11<sup>th</sup>  
moderate breeze from N E to E N E  
heading on starboard tack saw one sail  
bound N ward employed in painting  
blocks breaking out &c Lat 2.54 N  
Long 32.08 W

Saturday March 12<sup>th</sup>  
strong breeze from E N E and squally  
heading to the N ward under topsails and  
courses  
Lat 4.43 N  
Long 33.09 W

Sunday March 13<sup>th</sup>  
strong breeze from N E to E N E heading  
on starboard tack under topsails and  
courses  
Lat 5.50 N  
Long 34.00 W

Monday March 14<sup>th</sup>  
strong breeze from E N E to N E heading on  
starboard tack saw two sails and at 1 P M saw  
a shoal of 30 whales covered two boats the  
W Boat struck then the E Boat got foul line  
and cut lost him got the other one alongside  
chased until dark night getting ready to cut  
Joseph ferroman raised them Lat 7.00 N  
Long 34.48 W
