shout of 50 whales going quick 15 W one sail
ran into some of them at 9.30 headed the Se
and W boats and at 12 PM the Se boat went on &
one the whale saw the boat the boatster darted
under him went on again and he done the same
chased until 6 PM came on board and took in
sail one whale in sight Lat 38.23 N A.M
Long 19.34 W A.M
