

Sailed to the West Coast of Africa
 Sunday Oct 30th 1881
 First part fresh breeze from the Eastward
 with fine weather Bark steering by the Wind
 heading S. S. E. Middle part light wind
 saw some smoke the Bark Ohio or
 New Bedford Capt. Ellis 35 masts out
 with 2200 lbs of oil burnt from Latter
 part light air from the S. E. at 5.30 P.M.
 tacked ship and steered by the wind on
 Starboard tack heading about E. N. E.
 Lat 36.33. N. Long 61.14. W.

Monday Oct 31st
 First part light air and calm with
 clear weather Middle part light breeze the
 Bark steering by the wind heading about
 E. N. W. Latter part light breeze from the
 Westward and clear the Bark steering S. S. E.
 under all sail Bark out water during
 the day saw a merchant vessel steering
 to the North and Westward so ends
 Lat 36.24. N. Long 60.08. W.

Tuesday Nov 1st
 First part fresh breeze and pleasant
 middle part light breeze from the Westward
 Bark steering S. S. E. the crew employed in
 unshowering the cutting over latter part
 light air and fine weather saw merchant
 vessels this day Bark steering S. S. E.
 under all sail Lat 36.28. N. Long 57.43. W.

Wednesday Nov 2nd
 First part light breeze from the S. W.
 the Bark steering S. S. E. Middle part
 light air and calm saw a sail steering
 to the Westward Latter part light
 breeze from the N. E. the Bark steering
 S. E. under all sail
 Lat 36.28. N. Long 57.48. W.

 Thursday Nov 3rd 1881
 First part fresh breeze from the S. E. the
 Bark steering by the Wind on the Port tack
 Middle part strong breeze Bark out
 a cask of Flour and a barrel of Food Latter
 part strong breeze and clear weather steering
 by the wind on Port tack under topsail
 heading S. S. W. Lat 35.31. N. Long 57.27. W.

Friday Nov 4th
 First part strong breeze from the S. E. the
 Bark steering by the wind on the Port
 tack heading S. S. W. Middle part light
 4.47 gale from S. E. and cloudy with squalls
 of rain Latter part fresh gale the Bark
 7.05 steering by the wind on Port tack under
 close reefed foretop sail and single reefed
 topsail and storm sails

Saturday Nov 5th
 First part fresh gale from the S. E. with
 squalls of rain Middle part light breeze
 and calm with light showers of rain
 Latter part fresh gale from the N. W. E.
 and clear the Bark steering S. S. E. under
 close reefed foretop sail and single reefed
 and courses so ends this day

Sunday Nov 6th
 First part strong gale from N. W. E. the
 4.00 Bark steering S. S. E. under close reefed topsail
 and foresail Middle part moderate
 8.33 breeze with light showers of rain the Bark
 steering S. S. E. under all sail with wind from
 N. W. W.

Monday Nov 7th
 4.44 First part fine with light breeze from N. W.
 Middle part do - Latter part fine weather
 with fresh breeze from N. W. E. Bark steering
 S. S. E. under all sail crew employed
