

Journal of Bark *Ingapore*
Bound to the West Coast of Africa
Monday Nov. 28th 1881

No. 1. First part moderate gale from about Eby. N. the Bark steering by the wind on the Port tack under three reefed topsails and foresail. Middle part sent the bow clew of the main sail. Latter part the same squalls of rain all through the 24 hours. Bark heading S. E. by S.

Tuesday Nov. 29th

Lat. N. First part light gale and squalls
9.06 of rain. Middle part moderate
Long. W. made sail according latter part strong
29.30 breeze and pleasant the Bark steering by
the wind on the Port tack heading about
S. E. by S. Wind Eby. N. New ship set the
weather fore and main sail. Bark heading
during the day so ends

Wednesday Nov. 30th

Lat. N. First part strong breeze and pleasant
7.37 Wind Eby. N. saw two sails steering
Long. W. to the Northward. Middle and latter
28.15 part fresh breeze from about E. N. E.
Bark steering by the wind on the
Port tack heading from S. E. to S. S. E.
Broke out some small stores and
pumped three barres of water during
the day so ends fine

Thursday Dec. 1st

No. 1. First part strong breeze from E. N. E.
saw one sail steering to the Northward
Middle part fresh breeze and squally
with some rain and the same
latter part fresh breeze from S. E.
with some squalls saw a Finlock

Friday Dec. 2nd 1881

No. 1. First part light breeze with some squalls
of rain saw one sail steering to the Northward
Middle and latter part squally with rain
the most of the time. Wind from E. S. E. to
S. S. E. the Bark on the Port tack making
about S. S. W. Course under all sail

Saturday Dec. 3rd

No. 1. First part light breeze and squally the
Bark steering S. E. W. Wind E. S. E.
Middle part wind from E. N. E. to S. E.
the Bark steering South the most of the
time under all sail. Weather squally with
rain. Latter part light air and calm
with some rain at 3.30 P.M. lowered all
three Boats for exercise and practice the crew
came on Board at 5 P.M. so ends

Sunday Dec. 4th

Lat. N. These 24 hours light breeze from
35 East with pleasant weather the Bark
Long. W. steering South under all sail saw
7.35 a Steam Ship steering to the South &
Westward so ends

Monday Dec. 5th

Lat. N. First part light breeze from about
48 E. S. E. the Bark steering South. Weather some
Long. W. squalls of rain. Middle and latter part
7.57 light air and calm. Wind from E. S. E.
to South at sunset put the Bark on
the Starboard tack

Tuesday Dec. 6th

No. 1. First part light breeze and light showers
of rain wind about E. Middle part light
air and squally 11 A.M. Tacked ship
latter part light breeze and some rain
the Bark on the Port tack steering by the
Wind heading about W. S. W. saw two sails
