Sunday Feb. 25th 1883

Lat. S. 9. 48 First part of these 24 hours light-
Long. W. breeze from S.E. the Bark steering by the
15. 13 wind on the Port tack heading S.W. by S.
middle part fresh breeze latter part strong
breeze the Bark under sail according to the
breeze so ends this day

Monday Feb. 26th

Lat. S. 11. 12 First part strong breeze with fine weather
Long. W. 15. 56 Wind S.E. the Bark steering by the wind
on the Port tack heading S.W. by S. and
S.S.W. middle and latter part fresh
breeze. made sail according to the wind
so ends this day

Tuesday Feb. 27th

Lat. S. 13. 02 These 24 hours light breeze from
Long. W. 16. 29 S.E. with fine weather the Bark
steering by the wind on the Port tack
heading S.S.W. under all sail until
the Spanker and repaired it and
bent it again during the day
so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday Feb. 28th

Lat. S. 14. 38 These 24 hours light S.E. winds with
Long. W. 17. 05 fine weather the Bark steering by the
wind on the Port tack under all sail
heading from S.W. by S. to S.W. by W.

Thursday March 1st

Lat. S. 16. 17 These 24 hours fine breeze from about
Long. W. 16. 55 E. the Bark steering by the wind on
the Port tack heading from S. to
S.E. by S. latter part of the day
saw light showers of rain

Sunday March 2nd 1883

Lat. S. 17. 20 These 24 hours light breeze from S.E.
Long. W. 16. 40 with fine weather the Bark steering
by the wind on the Port tack heading
from S.S.W. to S.W. so ends

Monday March 3rd

Lat. S. 18. 33 These 24 hours light breeze from S.E.
Long. W. 16. 48 with fine weather excepting one or two
light squalls the Bark steering by the
wind on the Port tack heading about
S.S.W. so ends this day

Tuesday March 4th

Lat. S. 20. 24 These 24 hours strong breeze from S.E.
Long. W. 17. 20 and squally weather the Bark steering by
the wind on the Port tack heading
S.S.W.

Wednesday March 5th

Lat. S. 22. 08 The first part of these 24 hours strong
Long. W. 17. 52 breeze from S.E. fine weather middle and
latter part fresh breeze from about E.S.E.
the Bark steering by the wind on the
Port tack heading S.W. by E. until the
Foretopgallant sail and repaired it
during the day James Fagin sick of duty

Thursday March 6th

Lat. S. 23. 30 These 24 hours light breeze from E.S.E.
Long. W. 17. 50 the Bark steering by the wind on
the Port tack heading S. bent the
Foretopgallant sail in the morning
had two or three squalls during
the day so ends James Fagin
returned on duty
