Sunday April 15th 1883

These 24 hours strong breeze from S.E. to
Back steering by the wind on the Starboard
tack saw one Sail a Schooner supposed to
be the *Pinto* sailing to the N.E.

Back steering by the wind on the Starboard
tack heading E.N.W. some squally
during the day

tack saw a Steam Ship steering to the

These 24 hours fresh breeze from S.E. by S.
the Back steering by the wind on
the Starboard tack saw one Sail about
8.30 A.M. the Capt Chase of Bark *Finnee*
of New Bedford came on board
I dined with him until 6 P.M.
saw a Squid chasing the day
but saw nothing more

Wind S.E. the Back steering by the wind
on the Starboard tack sent *Algerine*
Blackfish the Bark *Finnee* in sight
all day
