 6.00 These 24 hours light breeze from S.W.
 Long= E. the Bark steering by the wind on the
 7.24 Port tack saw 3 men sick and off duty in the Forecastle

Lat= S. Tuesday Nov= 27th
 6.04 This day fresh breeze from S.W. with
 Long= E. fine weather saw Blackfish in the morning
 6.04 the Bark steering by the wind on the
 Port tack all through the 24 hours

Lat= S. Wednesday Nov= 28th
 6.10 This day light breeze and fine weather
 Long= E. the Bark steering by the wind at noon
 put the Bark on the Starboard tack
 saw a Barkentine steering Westward saw
 3 men sick and off duty

Lat= S. Thursday Nov= 29th
 6.02 These 24 hours light breeze from S.W. to S.W.
 Long= E. the Bark steering by the wind on the Starboard
 5.47 tack went the main topsail and bent a
 new one. The crew still sick and off duty

Lat= S. Friday Nov= 30th
 6.55 This 24 hours light breeze from S.W.
 Long= E. the Bark steering by the wind on the
 6.43 Starboard tack at 12 noon saw a
 School of Sperm Whales off the Low Bar
 coming to windward lowered the three
 Boats for them the Starboard Boat struck
 and got stove the L. Boat took the line killed
 the Whale and got him to the ship about
 2.30 P.M. at 4 P.M. began to cut
 finished 5.45 P.M. made all sail and
 steered by the wind all night so ends

Lat= S. Saturday Dec= 1st 1883
 Long= E. This 24 hours light breeze and fine
 weather at 6 A.M. raised a School of
 Sperm Whales going to windward lowered
 two Boats at 8.20. Starboard Boat struck
 killed him and got him to the ship
 at 10 A.M. cut in the Whale in the
 Afternoon and at night stood by
 Walter so ends

Lat= S. Sunday Dec= 2nd
 6.10 This day fresh breeze the Bark steering by
 Long= E. the wind at 3.15 A.M. began to bail sea
 7.02 one Sail John Santos sick and off duty

Lat= S. Monday Dec= 3rd
 These 24 hours fresh breeze and fine weather
 saw Blackfish and said Bark Seamen
 of New Bedford Capt= came on board in
 short time finished bailing 7.30 P.M.
 so ends the Bark steering by the wind
 on the Starboard tack

Lat= S. Tuesday Dec= 4th
 6.12 These 24 hours light breeze from S.W.
 Long= E. with fine weather the Bark steering
 7.43 by the wind on the Starboard tack
 saw the Seaman in the evening. the
 watch employed in stowing all and
 shifting fresh water so ends

Lat= S. Wednesday Dec= 5th
 6.28 This day light breeze from S.W. the Bark
 Long= E. steering by the wind on the Starboard tack
 7.53 saw 3 men sick and saw one Sail
 finished stowing down the oil during
 the day so ends
