

Tuesday March 18th 1884
 Lat. S. These 24 hours light breeze from S. S. E.
 19.45 and some squally the Bark steering N.
 Long. E under main top gallant sail
 28

Wednesday March 19th
 Lat. S. These 24 hours fresh breeze some squally
 18.04 Wind from S. S. E. the Bark steering
 Long. W. North the Watch employed in scoping
 33 spars saw 33 perisee

Thursday March 20th
 These 24 hours strong breeze and squally
 Wind from S. S. E. the Bark steering N.
 until 6 P. M. then changed the course
 to W. N. W. winds

Friday March 21st
 Lat. S. These 24 hours strong breeze from S. S. E.
 15.51 with squally weather the Bark steering to
 Long. W. W. N. W. saw a Ship steering to N. W. W.

Saturday March 22nd
 This day light wind from S. E. and squally
 at 2.36 A. M. sighted land the island of
 St Helena bearing W. by N. steered the
 Bark for it saw several sails during the day
 at 6.30 P. M. Anchored off Cameroun in
 12 fathoms of water with 40 fathoms of
 Chain on starboard Anchor and most of
 the crew on shore at night

Sunday March 23rd
 This day fine the ship at Anchor
 two men on shore for the day and
 night

Monday March 24th
 This day fine the 4 men on board employed
 in washing ship outside decks
 three men on shore at night

Tuesday March 25th 1884
 These 24 hours some squalls of rain but
 fair weather employed at various jobs on board

Wednesday March 26th
 This day fine weather excepting a few showers
 of rain got an Anchor from shore and
 shackled it to the Port Cable and changed
 ends with the Port Cable

Thursday March 27th
 These 24 hours fresh breeze and
 squalls of rain

Friday March 28th
 This day fresh breeze and at night
 long chain began to paint ship
 outside

Saturday March 29th
 This day some light showers of rain
 employed in painting a part of
 the ship

Sunday March 30th
 This day fine weather and half of the men
 on shore

Monday March 31st
 This day fine with passing squalls of
 rain got a Mason from shore and
 had him employed in repairing the
 top masts

Tuesday April 1st
 This day fair weather at night some
 rain the Mason still employed on
 the top masts and the crew painting ship

Wednesday April 2nd
 This day fair weather with a few light
 squalls of rain finished the top masts in the
 morning the crew employed painting
