

Tuesday June 17th 1884

Lat-S. 8.20
Long-W 12.10
These 24 hours light breeze and cloudy had a shower of rain in the evening took in the Whistle Boat and repaired her and put her on the Starboard Paw crane and put the Starboard Paw Boat on the house and took the one off the house and put on the Whistle Crane and at 9. A.M. lowered the two gaff-boats for a Humpback but did not get on came on board at 10. A.M. the Bark steering by the wind during the night and steering N. E. by N during the day at sunset luffed to the wind on the Port Tack

Wednesday June 18th

Lat-S. 8.04
Long-W 11.58
These 24 hours light breeze from South weather fine the Bark steering by the wind on the Starboard Tack I saw Finback and a Humpback during the day

Thursday June 19th

Lat-S. 7.33
These 24 hours light breeze and cloudy the Bark steering Eastward at 8.30 A.M. sighted land about a part of the N. C. by W. got up the cables and started on the Anchor saw a Whaling Bark at Anchor to windward at sunset Anchored the Bark with the Port Anchor in 14 fathoms of Water with 30 fathoms of Chain

Friday June 20th

Lat-S. 7.15
These 24 hours light breeze at daylight lowered the Boats and cruised for Humpbacks saw 3 about 5. P.M. Lat Boat struck at 6. P.M. began to tow him to the ship got him alongside and made fast at 8.30 so end saw the Bk. A. R. Tucker of New Bedford

Saturday June 21st 1884

This day light breeze and calm at daylight called all hands and got ready to cut in the Whale began to cut at 6.30 A.M. and finished and lowered the two gaff-boats at 10. and cruised for Whales but saw nothing Boats got on board at 6.30. P.M. so end

Sunday June 22nd

These 24 hours light breeze and fine weather at daylight lowered the two gaff-boats and cruised saw nothing the Whistle Boats crew on board boiling Boats got on board at 5.30. P.M. so end boiling

Monday June 23rd

These 24 hours light breeze from Southward at daylight hove up Anchor and steered the Bark Northward down the Coast saw the Bk. A. R. Tucker finished Boiling all three Boats cruised all day but saw no Humpback at 8. P.M. Anchored the Bark in 10 fathoms of Water and payed out 30 fathoms of Chain

Tuesday June 24th

These 24 hours light breeze and calm at daylight hove up Anchor and steered the Bark down the Coast lowered all three Boats and cruised saw nothing Boats got on board at 5.30. P.M. at 8.30. P.M. Anchored the Bark in 7 fathoms of Water and payed out 25 fathoms of Chain
