

Sunday July 27th 1884

This day light breeze and calm with fine weather at daylight lowered three Boats and cruised saw one Whale three sightings and saw one more of him Boats got on board at 6 P.M. so ends

Monday July 28th

This day light breeze and calm with fine weather at daylight lowered three Boats and cruised saw three Whales but did not get near them Boats got on board at 6.20 P.M. so ends

Tuesday July 29th

This day light breeze and calm at daylight lowered three Boats and cruised saw nothing Boats got on board at 6.30 P.M.

Wednesday July 30th

This day light breeze and fine weather at daylight lowered three Boats and cruised about 9 A.M. saw a Whale at 10 A.M. Starboard Boat struck at 11.30. began to tow the Whale to the ship got him to the ship at 3.30 P.M. and began to cut in and finished about 7 P.M. so ends

Thursday July 31st

This day fine breeze and pleasant weather at 7 A.M. lowered the two quarter Boats and cruised saw one Whale but got none saw two from the ship the White Boats crew on board cutting up the blubber Boats got on board at 6 P.M.

Friday August 1st 1884

This day light breeze and fine weather at 7 A.M. lowered three Boats and cruised saw 3 Whales 2 of them going Southward Boats got on board at 8 P.M. at 9 P.M. began to boil so ends this day

Saturday August 2nd

This day light breeze and calm at 6.30 A.M. lowered the two quarter Boats saw nothing got on board at 6.30 P.M. finished boiling at 4.30 P.M. so ends Thomas A.W. franked myself sick and off duty

Sunday August 3rd

These 24 hours light breeze and cloudy at 6.30 A.M. lowered the three Boats and cruised about 9.30 Starboard Boat struck killed him and two Boats by him about 10 miles from the ship got the Bark under way at about 2 P.M. and got the Whale alongside about 8 P.M. and Anchored the Bark again at 12 midnight sharks began to eat the Whale so had to call all hands and cut him in saw a plenty of Whales during the day. Thomas A.W. still off duty

Monday August 4th

This day fresh breeze at 6.30 A.M. called all hands and broke out some provisions about 10 A.M. lowered three Boats saw about 15 Whales at about 11 A.M. Starboard Boat struck and the Whale rolled the Boat over and took the lines got the Boat all righted and got to the ship about 12 noon the other two Boats got on board at 6 P.M. so ends Thomas A.W. still off duty
