

Monday August 25th 1884

This day light breeze and cloudy at daylight lowered three Boats & saw several Whales going Southward and one going Northward Boats got on board at 6 P.M. Nicholas Lawrence and Penna still off duty

Tuesday August 26th

This day light breeze and fine weather at 6.30 A.M. hove up Anchor and steered the Bark into Marmora Bay for Wood at 8.30. Anchored got off six Boat loads of Wood during the day so ended Penna returned to duty Nicholas Lawrence still off duty

Wednesday August 27th

This day fresh breeze and cloudy got on board eight Boat loads of Wood during the day sold the Starboard Row Boat and sent her on shore Nicholas Lawrence still off duty so ended

Thursday August 28th

This day light breeze and fine weather at 6.30 A.M. lowered the two greater Boats and cruised for Whales & sent the Waiste Boat in for Wood got off two Boat loads and at about 10.30 hove up Anchor and steered the Bark off shore on the Starboard tack about 12 noon saw a Whale from the ship lowered the Waiste Boat and called the other two Boats down at about 1.30 P.M. Starboard Boat struck killed him and got him to the ship about 2.30. At about 4. began to cast finished about 7 P.M. so ended Nicholas Lawrence still off duty

Friday August 29th

This day light breeze all hands on board hasting up blubber at 2.30 P.M. began to boil saw several Whales going Southward Nicholas Lawrence still off duty

Saturday August 30th

This day light breeze with fine weather employed in boiling at 12 noon hove up Anchor and steered the Bark off shore by the wind on the Port tack heading S.W. by W. finished boiling at 8.30 P.M. so ended Nicholas Lawrence still off duty

Sunday August 31st

These 24 hours light breeze from S.E. the weather cloudy with a light shower of rain the Bark steering by the wind on the Port tack heading S.W. by W. Nicholas Lawrence still off duty

Monday Sept 1st

This day light breeze and cloudy weather the Bark steering by the wind on the Port tack heading about West saw a fin back the crew employed in stowing down the Oil Nicholas Lawrence still off duty

This 24 hours light breeze and fine weather the Bark steering by the wind on the Port tack heading W. N. W. saw a merchant Brig steering Eastward and saw a Humphreys finished stowing down during the day stowed in all about 50 bbls Nicholas Lawrence still off duty
