This 24 hours begins with light winds from the South East by which all hands employed in turning the rigging about 2 P.M. we saw a ship of the Larboard bow standing to West then we saw a spout and could not see what it was the middle part of this 24 hours began to set up the rigging and in the latter part the wind became more to the East and was light so that we saw that it was so ends this 24 hours latitude by observation 25° 10' South

This 24 hours begins with light winds from the South East and we steer about South East by which all hands employed in setting up the rigging and about 4 P.M. we finished them and got into sea I expect that we shall be in the middle part of the 24 hours squally we had a fresh mist and latitude by observation 25° 10' South

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the South West all hands employed in setting up the rigging and about 8 P.M. we finished them and got into sea I expect that we shall be in the middle part of the 24 hours squally we had a fresh mist and latitude by observation 25° 10' South

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the same quarter the sea are still breaking out about 3 P.M. saw a ship at 4 P.M. and at 5 P.M. we finished her and made down again the middle part the rigging shifted and about 8 P.M. we finished them and got into sea I expect that we shall be in the middle part of the 24 hours squally we had a fresh mist and latitude by observation 25° 10' South

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
