

Wednesday
the 11 Day
1827

This 24 hours commences with strong winds from the West set the fore topmast and masted the fore topmast and set him and about 8 o'clock the foot of the mainsail hauled and we were that the middle part light winds from the West then we made sail and set the fore topmast and fore ship and stood to South west one watch below and the rest breaking out for water about 11 AM the began to blow so that we had to reef and in the fore about 12 M the foremast stem down so ends this 24 hours Latitude 35.10

Thursday
the 12 Day
1827

This 24 hours begins with strong gales from the west more west and we steer SW by S. The wind one watch below and the rest fitting the main spring stay and set it up an about the stay set and at 4 PM we hauled up the mainsail and set the stay set and found that it was the fore was stay set strong Gale continues The middle part strong gales the latter part moderate all hand employed in bending up sails so ends this 24 hours Latitude 35.10

Friday
the 13 Day
1827

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the west & west all hands employed in duty At 4 PM the wind began to blow and about 7 PM we reefed the fore and main topmast and hauled down the gill and spanker The middle part light wind the latter part moderate all about the new main sail so ends this 24 hours Latitude 36.18

Thursday
the 12 Day
1827

This 24 hours begins with Calms all hands employed in ship duty we hauled the old fore topmast at 3 PM we saw a school of killer mackerel to wind and Calms till about 10 PM then wind sprung up from the west & east and set the fore topmast & main sail and about the latter P. M. so laid that we were of force to take them in and the topgallant and about 11 AM we took a reef in the fore and in the main in the fore topmast so ends this 24 hours Latitude 35.25 South

Friday
the 13 Day
1827

This 24 hours begins with strong gales from the West & West and our course is South west nothing doing it being Sunday one watch below moderate till about 6 PM then wind began to breeze the middle part squally the latter part more moderate but light squalls of rain one watch below so ends this 24 hours Latitude 37.4

Saturday
the 14 Day
1827

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the South west and we steer about south east all about 10 PM the wind one watch below about 4 PM it blew squally and hauled the watch and hauled up the main topmast and found him strong and squally about 6 PM we took a reef in each top sail and about the middle part reefed the fore so that about 3 PM we tucked ship and stood the South by west about 7 PM one watch below the employed so ends this 24 hours Latitude 38.21

Sunday
the 15 Day
1827

This 24 hours begins with light winds from the West one watch below the rest employed At 4 PM the watch came on deck and started at 1 PM up in the boat at 7 PM light wind the latter part is very heavy and pretty good middle part set the topmast and topgallant & fore sail latter part hauled in the stinging and lower course so ends with calm weather Latitude 39.18 South
