Sail. Shute tied a drum in set over the 1st moderate
all 12 m So. ends this 24 hours Latitude 57.48

the 2 Day
1828

This 24 hours begins with light winds and squally
rain from the N.W. at 8 am ship was stood too
the 1st a very heavy sea took possession round the ship
but could not catch them at 8 pm the wind blew
from the S.W. and showers of rain about 10 o'clock the
fore top sail and about 4 pm took the fore and
strong winds from the N.W. about 9 am the
round and stood too the 1st about 11 am main
sail and got up the masts so that this 24 hours
Latitude 58.14

Sunday
the 3 Day
1828

This 24 hours begins with moderate wind and heavy
sea from the N.W. and we star 6 o'clock too
moderate till 4 pm then the wind breezed and
it shook the 1st of these round and stood too the 1st
about 10 pm the wind hauled round too the 1st square
the yards and shot out the reefs out of the 1st
about 4 am the wind hauled too the 1st and at
5 am sent up the main topsails and fore sail
sent the fore topmast stunsail boom and
the stunsail strong winds from the S.W. 11
Wind breezed took in the stunsail strong till 11
C. 11 So ends this 24 hours Latitude 58.14
