At 1 pm took in the stunsails and top sails 2 on the mast reef. The top sail and took the oars out of the lee boats at 10 pm. Saw the friends off the 1/2 below so ends this 24 hours. Latitude 40 N Longitude

Wednesday
the 26th Day
1828

This 24 hours begins with strong gales from the north east one 1/2 below and the rest employed in getting off water the friends is off the 1/2 below all the middle strong and rainy all 1 pm past the friends under our lee at 9 am. She was 3 miles of stern one 1/2 below and the rest employed. So ends this 24 hours. Latitude by reckoning 40 N Longitude
