the 29 Day
1828

one watch below and the rest employed at
4 pm more moderate moderate all the
middle and latter the friends is off the
harbour quarried about 5 m. nothing
seen so ends this 24 hours Latitude 5°

Sunday
the 30 Day
1828

This 24 hours begins with light wind
from the S.W. and the course S.W. by W one
watch below and the rest employed in ships duty
all the middle strong and the latter
more moderate nothing seen the friends
is off the lee quarried about 5 miles
at 4 pm so ends this 24 hours Latitude 5°

from the S.W. and we steer full
land by one watch below and the rest
employed at 4 pm moderate moderate all the middle
and the latter strong breeze at 6 am 2 hours

At 7 am but could not see the friends
pass out off sight to the S.W. so ends
this 24 hours Latitude

Tuesday
the 1 Day
April 1828

this 24 hours begins with moderate wind
from the S.W. one watch below and we
employed at 4 pm moderate breeze
out the after and got up
rice all the middle part strong
breeze from the S.W. all the latter
strong so ends this 24 hours Latitude 14° 29' N.

Wednesday
the 2 Day
1828

This 24 hours begins with moderate wind
from the S.W. and we steer and we
about one watch below and we see
cloud in ships duty nothing seen too day
sloop possess and they were going quick
at 4 pm thick and cloudy but the wind
pass moderate about 12 pm strong breeze from
the S.W. all the latter moderate so ends 16° 47' N.

from the S.W. and we steer S.W. by W
about 12 am the wind held out to
the S.W. and we steer S.W. by W one watch below
light all the middle and the latter strong
and showers of rain one watch below the rest
employed at 11 am tansague heard so ends
Latitude
