NE and at 10 to 12 the NE wind
of 5, a sea at 11 tacked to SE
at 11 pm had both cables bent
and the all Reddy and about 12 fire
at 1 pm so ends this 24 hours

Q. 1812 A. Year

June 18 the Congress of the United States
Declared war with Great Britain July 12
Burrhead invaded by General Hull July 17
The garrisons of Mackinaw who were ignorant
Of declaration of hostilities captured by a
Party of British and Indians
July 18 the frigate Constitution cap Hull
Under passage from Chesapeake Bay to
New York Escaped from an English ship
Of the line and 3 frigates who had chased
her for 60 hours
August 8th
Gen Hull relinquished the plan of invading
Fort Mifflin and returning to Detroit
With his Army

August 9th
A detachment under Gen Miller attacked
Bear Island lower Michigan by a superior
Body of British and Indians the latter
Commanded by Tecumseh and defeated
After a sanguinary conflict in which the
Americans lost 33 men and the enemy
Wounded of 100 men - August 16th
Gen Hull surrendered the Army and
His command to the British General
Brook & prisoners of war for this he was
Died by a Court martial and
