

Noland's Journal

Saturday the 27 Day of June 1828 30°C
On the morning of the 27 fine weather Saw whales
At head board the boats And put for them
They went Down at 8 when they came Up the
Captain was the next to them and he struck
But soon got lost and then then I sent mate
Went Up and I sent by that time the boat
All got their and then the Land and Boat
Sent me and Old Coleman was in her and we
Landed her and among them all hit her
And got her along side and cut part of her
and then took in sail about 8 pm the
Wind began to blow and flights of rain
Only On the morning of the 28 Sunday finished
Cutting got in the Grunk and lost the case. Very
Rugget and strong wind washed the Deck and
And began to boyl strong and at 12 M began
To blow and by 3 pm blew a gale at 5 pm
Took in the fore sail and sail of the

All about 2 pm the wind so hard that we
Had to put out the fires and let it lay till Day
Bright and then the rain ceased we Bayed till
The 29 the Monday till the Sun set and then had
But about 20 lbs of Blubber Left fine weather
At about 8 O'clock light wind and clear but
A heavy swell of rising from the S.W. &c
At 11 finished Boiling and stode off the Whelp
Room & at Daylight Coopered all that was
Baid the last whale and then began to stow
Down about 5 pm had 80 Od lbs stowed so fine
Fed for the night and set the water strong
Winds from the South and a stiff sea &c
On the morning of the 2 Day July finished
Stowing the fore haul the Star side and Beg
in in the after haul about 11 am & at 4 pm
Saw Whales about 20 & land I went in the Land
Board Boat with the Secout Mate Becas the
Mate was sick here Bedding Every 2 or 3 times
at Day I sent and struck of 50 lbs Whale
And then the 3 Mate struck and killed 2
and got them along side and secured them
