

About 4 pm another Whale came up close to
right in our wake the Captain landed and called
to him and he went to the windward and he came
on board again. Whales all around blowing us out
off water but we have no cast net for two
out them in only 1 Cooper and Lee and Old Man
So we can't get along very well at dark we
the boat and set the watch and the watch on
into the water but fine weather and cloudy
this whale is about 40 lbs. whale off here
that on the 14th the only called all hands & washed
the deck and began to boil at 4 pm we
rugged for cutting but however we
it is had the body in & at 4 pm had the
back baited and began to boil at 4 pm we
saw more whales close to but did not
loan wind about 10 and quite strong
at dark at 1 pm had most all the head
boiled fine weather on the 16th too hands all
for to look for whale we have a puff of
present Bayley all the day till 9 in the morning
and then finish thick heavy clouds have covered
the atmosphere but a little wind from the S.W.

On the 16th continues the same kind of weather
finish Bayley about 7 am and then
breakfast and began to stow down
at 8 am saw a ship of the lee beam of
at 10 am spoke him it was the boat
ser of London Captain Muter 17 months out
with 1500 lbs want 500 more they had not seen
whales for 8 days & we saw them this morning
at close too but want needly for them fine
and light wind from the S.W. and a puff
sea off 4 that ship was out off sight too at
11 am we lay with the sails all filled
fore & main top sail & foresail & close to
the main top sail & close to the day on the
17th the fine weather & clear off but saw nothing
we are going stowing down at 4 pm cleared
the starboard side between decks and got ready
for to stow at 8 pm more round and back
for the south the whole atmosphere is covered
with heavy clouds and it looks as though
we were going to have some foul weather &
on the 18th fine weather all hands employed in
down at 11 am saw a ship of the lee beam
