

On Jan the 24th the fine weather with the local
wind about 10 and light at 10 am got up the
new sails and Middlestitch them at 4 pm
finisht then got up moccasins nothing seen
from the coast this day wind continued light
at 12 the our latitude was 30.00
On the 25th the fine weather a wind from the
S.W. and a fine breeze all hands employed in clean-
ing the fore-castle at 4 pm finisht at 5 pm
The wind hauled to the S.E. and breeze in evening
seen from the coast lead latitude 29.02
On the 26th the fine weather wind strong from
the S.W. all hands employed in scrubbing the
the cabin at 4 pm finisht at 5 pm wind con-
tinued strong and squally so, ends the transactions
off the day latitude by observations 27.30
In the morning off the 27th strong wind from the
S.W. as before but nothing remarkable strange
on board being Sunday nothing doing the wind
continued strong all day at 7 pm heft the
main topsail our latitude this day by connect
observation was 25.57 - On the 28th the strong
from the N.W. and squally all hand employed
in ships duty nothing seen from the coast
this day latitude at noon was 24.17
On the 29th the fine weather wind from the S.W.
and strong all hand employed in ships duty
at 12 the latitude 22.17 at 3 pm made the land
call it Monacoy in about 4 hours raised the
hull's land and the cap struck and the second
mate and all 4 boats saved the 3 mates

And the second mate the Captains sunk on
long side and the mates after towing 3 hours
broke loose and could not find him came on
board and got supper and set the watch 4
atches tonight & the land is off the lee latitude
only on the morning off the 30th went too cutting it
being very rugged did not finisht till 12 at noon
then made sail the land bore about south and we
ran till night with the wind upon the quarter
and then brought too between Monacoy and the
south bound off Monacoy saw an English ship tack-
ling off and on the land at 12 this night had
half the blueber void strong gales from the S.W.
In the morning of the 1st day off October fine weather
finisht by 10 am and by 4 pm had the
ships cleared and the cables bent at 1 pm anchored
at Pitetee Bay in the harbour lay 2 whale ships
the 1 the Ontario and the Menerva with 4
all full 1 ship at the bar besides our selves
So ends this cruise &c
After passed off 2 all of the 1st of
November we have arrived in the
latitude 21.59 South and longitude 104.00
And in the time we have wooded
at the Moravian Islands saw the frank-
line of merchant off their she had 300 lbs
17 months but cap chase and she has got 40 lbs
barrils gun selos 2 days ago saw a ship
off the sea beam in about 1 day went did not
know him the 24th to 1st January 1830
