Latitude
th 1st May
1830

The first part commenced with drizzle
Winds and showers of rain At 2 am
line went too worked on the rigging
At 4 o'clock off saw 2 sails to the
Leeward At 7 in the morning spoke
the brig blinda off Salina 8 hours
from Pernambuco Went on board
& got some fruit so ends Latitude 8.6

Sunday
th 2nd

These 24 hours commenced with gentle
breezes on bent the cables and stode
away from 7 sails in sight Beside
Cathamarans All the middle part gentle
breezes from the S.E. and pleasant weather
In At 7 am All hands Employed
In planning the stowage and forecas
the work till 12 then finished so ends

Monday
th 3rd May

Gentle breezes and fair weather 2 sails
in sight from the South
At 2 am Whit washed the S & N

May the 3rd Day 1830

In the morning off the 3 day fine weather all hands
began working on the rigging saw 2 sails ahead too
fine weather all the day At 7 am the wind
bent to the ENE and breezed so the transactions off
to day Latitude 3.53 In the 4th day fine weather
with light winds No sails in sight At 10 am on the
the shipker and mended that and the rest part
off the line all hands Employed in fitting
The rigging At 5 am docked off and cleared
the deck so ends this days drift Latitude at

12 this day was 2.53 In the morning
off the 5th Tuesday fine weather and a gentle
breeze All hands Employed in fitting the
rigging saw 2 sails off the starboard bow & tanned
to the North supposed they were whale ships At
4 am started at back off water so ends this day
Latitude At 12 was 14.28 South on the 6th Wednesday
fine weather all hands Employed in brupping and
fitting rigging saw painting 2 sails ahead At
3 am the wind died and became light At 5 am
Am cleared the decks so ends the day Latitude
At 12 was 9 miles North on the 7th Thursday
fine weather with gentle gales from the S.W.
All hands Employed in scrapping the ship saw
2 sails ahead at 3 in the afternoon the ship saw
to the windward headed to the S.E. continued fine
weather all the day so ends Latitude At 12
was 1.10 North
