Remarks on board Saturday May 29th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with a fine breeze from the NE and pleasant weather Laying off and on at Atlei. Capt on Shore a Trailing for Hogs at 4 P.M. finished Trailing and came on board with 40 in number several fresh ^{3 P.M.} Onions, and shared SW by W. Stowed the Anchors and Heard up the decks, Middle part light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant weather steering SW by S and SW. Taboora and Oncheaw in sight. Latter part calm employed in picking over Potatoes saw nothing So Ends these 24 hours

Lat by Obs 21° 25' N Long 160° 30' W

Remarks on board Sunday May 30th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with a calm and pleasant weather, at 1 P.M. Taboora leaving NE by E dist 15 miles. Middle part calm and pleasant Latter part light air from the NE and pleasant steering W by S under all sail saw nothing So Ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Monday May 31st 1847

These 24 hours Commences with light breeze from the NE and pleasant weather steering W by S under all sail. Middle part the same Latter part light breeze from the NE and pleasant steering West at 10 A.M. set Fore Top mast ~~Fore~~ and Lower Studding sails employed in picking over Potatoes saw Tin bark So Ends

Lat by Obs 21° 31' N Long 162° 38' W

Remarks on board Tuesday At June 1st 1847

These 24 hours Commences light NE Trades and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter part the same steering West. Commenced stanning 3 watches saw nothing So Ends these 24 hours

These 24 hours Commences with light breeze from the Northward and pleasant weather steering W by N under all sail. Middle part the same. Latter part light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant steering SW by W. ~~Employed~~ employed in ships duty saw nothing So Ends

Lat by Obs 21° 45' N Long 165° 10' W

Remarks on board Thursday June 3^d 1847

These 24 hours Commences with light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant weather steering SW by W under all sail at 6 P.M. Landed away the boats to learn the crew the art of Whaling. Middle and Latter part light breeze from the NE and pleasant, steering WSW. employed in ships duty saw nothing So Ends

Lat by Obs 21° 32' N Long 165° 57' W

Remarks on board Friday June 4th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with light Trades from the NE and pleasant weather, steering WSW under all sail. Middle part the same, Latter part light Trades from NE and pleasant steering WSW employed in mending old Fore Top sail. saw nothing So Ends

Lat by Obs 21° 32' N Long 167° 36' W

Remarks on board Saturday June 5th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with light Trades from the NE and pleasant steering WSW. Middle part the same Latter part fine breeze from the Northward and pleasant steering West under all sail employed in ships duty saw nothing So Ends
