Then 24 hours Moderate breeze with some rain, got off
3 Cords of Wood and 15 Bbls of Sweet Potatoes
Starboard Watch on Liberty

Remarks on board Friday Oct 22^d 1847

Then 24 hours Moderate breeze with some rain
Starboard Watch on Liberty

Remarks on board Saturday Oct 23^d 1847

Then 24 hours Moderate breeze with some rain
Starboard Watch on Liberty Ship Portsmouth Sailed

Remarks on board Sunday Oct 24th 1847

Then 24 hours Moderate breeze and variables with some
rain Starboard Watch on Liberty Ship Leonides
Sailed got of 96 gallons of Molasses

Remarks on board Monday Oct 25th 1847

Then 24 hours Moderate breeze from the S and Eastward
and rainy weather Starboard watch on Liberty
got of a raft of Water

Remarks on board Tuesday Oct 26th 1847

Commences with Moderate breeze from the Southward
and rainy weather at 7 AM the Captain and Pilot
came on board, got the Ship Under Weigh, bound for
Monroe, at 10 AM the Pilot left us with a strong Easterly
wind, saw 2 Ships steering in for Hills Bay took two
Knackers as Passengers, but they will join the ship at Monroe

Remarks on board Ship Maslunio

Remarks on board Wednesday Oct 27th 1847

Then 24 hours Commences with brisk Trades from the
Eastward and pleasant steering at 9 AM under
all sail at 7 PM hauled on the Wind to the
Northward under Double reef Top sails, Middle part
^{mind} the same at 9 PM kept off WNW at 1 AM hauled
to to the Northward with the Main yard a back at
6 AM made all sail and steered for the Port of Monroe
at 10 AM saw 13 ships Lazing at Anchor
So Ends with light baffling wind

Remarks on board Thursday Oct 28th 1847

Then 24 hours Commences with light air and
bafflings employed in Towing ship at 7 PM
came at Anchor in 20 fathoms of Water, William Morris
Broke ^{one of} his foot bones getting down the Ship side in to the
Boat, Doctor Peabody came on board and set it
Middle and Latter part light air and pleasant
Discharged our Fourth Mate 2 Boatstewers, Cooper, and 7
Seven of the Crew
