Remarks on board Saturday November 6th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with light breeze and variable and cloudy weather with some rain at 2 P.M. the Captain went on shore at Waahoo Ship Laying off and on, 26 ships Laying at Anchor in the Harbour, at 6 P.M. the Captain returned on board, Middle part squally from the SE heading to the Land Westward at 3 P.M. were ship heading to the Eastward, Latter wind the same too rugged for the Captain to go on shore again. more ship to the Southward So Ends

Remarks on board Sunday Nov 7th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with strong wind from the SE and squally weather. Stowed the anchors and Unbent the Cables at 3 P.M. heavy squall from the Eastward Ship under Close reef Top sails heading SSE. Middle part squally from the SE heading to the Land Westward under Close reef Top sails. Latter part squally at 6 P.M. were ship heading E by N So Ends No observation

Remarks on board Monday Nov 8th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with heavy squalls from SSE heading to the Eastward under Close reef Top sails. Middle part more moderate heading to the S and Westward Latter part calm and pleasant, Hands employed in Ships Duty. Saw Waahoo bearing NE by E Dist 40 miles So Ends these 24 hours

Lat by Obs 20° 50' N Long 158° 17' W

Remarks on board Tuesday Nov 9th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with a calm and pleasant weather. Middle and Latter part the same, Coal and the Chainable and Stowed ^{down} below Waahoo in sight bearing NE Dist 45 miles So Ends

Lat by Obs 20° 44' N

Remarks on board Wednesday Nov 10th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with a calm and pleasant weather. Middle part light breeze from the Northward and pleasant steering SSE under all sail. Latter the same Hands employed in Ships Duty one sail in sight So Ends these 24 hours

Lat by Obs 20° 05' N Long 157° 39' West

Remarks on board Thursday Nov 11th

These 24 hours Commences with light breeze from the Northward and pleasant weather steering SE by S Middle and Latter part light breeze from the Eastward and cloudy weather heading to the Southward under all sail, 3 sail in sight So Ends

Lat by Obs 18° 15' N

Remarks on board Friday Nov 12th 1847

These 24 hours Commences with light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant. Middle and Latter part the same heading SSE under all sail Hands employed in Ships Duty one sail in sight So Ends

Lat by Obs 16° 32' N
