Remarks on board Sunday Nov 21st 1847

These 24 hours commences with squally weather and variables, at 4 P.M. wind from the Southward wore ship to the Eastward. Middle and Latter part breeze from the S.E. and pleasant heading E.N.E. under short sail saw nothing So Ends

Lat by Obs 7° 24' N Long 151° 23' West

Remarks on board Monday Nov 22^d 1847

These 24 hours commences with moderate breeze from the S.E. and pleasant heading E.N.E. Middle and Latter part Light breeze from the N.E. and pleasant heading to the S and Eastward Hands employed in ships Duty saw nothing So Ends

Lat by Obs 7° 18' N

Remarks on board Tuesday Nov 23^d 1847

These 24 hours commences with moderate breeze from the N.E. and pleasant. Middle part moderate breeze from the Eastward with some rain heading to the Southward James Jones ill and ill ^{turn} in the night got up and went as high as the Main Top with a Sheath Knife in his Mouth 3 of the Watch brought him down the complained being in great pain and like wine short of breath the Captain gave him some Laudanum and some other Medicines Latter part Light breeze from the E with some rain bent and old fore sail

Remarks on board Wednesday Nov 24th 1847

These 24 hours commences with moderate breeze from the Eastward and pleasant heading to the S Middle and Latter part Light wind and variables with some rain working to the S and Eastward saw nothing So Ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Thursday Nov 25th

These 24 hours commences with moderate breeze from the Southward and pleasant. Middle and Latter part the same heading to the Eastward. Hands employed in ships Duty saw nothing So Ends

Lat by Obs 5° 24' N

Remarks on board Friday Nov 26th 1847

These 24 hours commences with Light wind and variables. Middle and Latter part Light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant heading to the Southward under all sail Hands employed in ships Duty saw nothing So Ends these 24 hours

Lat by Obs 4° 44' N Long 148° 57' West

Remarks on board Saturday Nov 27th 1847

These 24 hours commences with moderate breeze from the Eastward and pleasant. Middle part fresh breeze with some rain heading to the Southward Latter part variable, working to the S and Eastward, one sail in sight So Ends these 24 hours
