Northward and hazy weather heading to the
Westward at 3 P.M. spoke the Ship Mount Vernon
of New Bedford and jammed with the 3 Ships
Middle and Latter part fresh breeze from the North
ward heading to the Eastward Ship Splendid
and Bark Newton and Ship Mount Vernon
in company one sail in sight to the Westward
So Ends Lat 32 " 38 N Long

Remarks on board Saturday April 15th
Then 24 hours Commences with fresh breeze
from the Northward and pleasant weather
heading E.N.E. at 2 P.M. saw the Island Lays bearing
East Dist 45 miles Middle and Latter part Light
wind and variable working to the Northward
in company with the Ship Splendid 3 other
Ships in sight So Ends

Lat by Obs 32 " 58 N Long 128 " 30 East

Remarks on board Sunday April 16th
Then 24 hours Commences with moderate breeze
from the N.E. and pleasant weather Middle and
Latter part Light wind and variables working
to the Northward in company with the Ship
Splendid & other Ships in sight got the
Starboard Anchor off the Bow So Ends
Lat by Obs 33 " 30 N Long 128 " 33 East

Remarks on board Monday April 17th
Then 24 hours Light breeze and variables and pleasant
weather at 6 A.M. saw the Island Lisians bearing E.N.E.
Dist 15 miles So Ends steering through the Western
Passage saw a number of Fishing Boats

Lat by Obs 34 " 22 N Long 128 " 53 East

Remarks on board Tuesday April 18th 1848
Then 24 hours Commences with Light wind and variable
and pleasant weather steering to the N and Eastward
at 6 P.M. the North point of Lisians Island
bearing E by N Dist 15 miles strong Current
setting to the Northward Middle part Calm Latter
fresh breeze from the S.E. and thick weather
steering N.E. by E. in company with the Ship
Splendid So Ends with rainy weather
Lat by Obs 35 " 25 N Long 130 " 35 East

Remarks on board Wednesday April 19th
Then 24 hours Commences with strong wind from
the Southward and rainy weather steering N.E.
at 2 P.M. Doubled reef the top sails and furlled
the Main sail at 6 P.M. hove too Under a Close reef
Main Top sail heading to the Eastward Latter
part Light breeze and variable, saw Right
Whales and Chased with out ^{Success} Whales will saw
7 Ship all Chasing but with out success So Ends
Lat by Obs 36 " 20 N Long 131 " 36 East

Remarks on board Thursday April 20th
Then 24 hours moderate breezes and variable and
pleasant weather employed in Chasing Whales
the Waist boat fastened and the Irons drawn several
Ships in sight So Ends, Lat 36.40

Remarks on board Friday April 21st
Commences with Light airs from the Westward and
pleasant Middle and Latter part hazy, Chased Whales
with out Success several Sail in sight So Ends
Lat 36 " 54 N
