Remarks on board Monday May 8th 1848
 These 24 hours Commences with Moderate breeze from the Northward and pleasant employed in boiling one ship in sight. Middle part the same Latter part Moderate breeze from the Eastward and pleasant. Lowerd for Whales got one to the Starboard boat He died under water and sunk heavy obliged to take the Lines to the Ship and heave him up So Ends with the Whale a long side 140 fathoms under water

Remarks on board Tuesday May 9th 1848
 These 24 hours Commences with Moderate breeze from the Eastward and pleasant weather employed in heaving up the Whale at 5 P.M. got him up and fluke roped. Middle part pleasant employed in boiling Latter part pleasant at 7 P.M. finished boiling, at 8 P.M. commenced Cutting at half past 11 P.M. finished Cutting So Ends
 Lat by Obs

Remarks on board Wednesday May 10th
 These 24 hours Commences with a fresh breeze from the Southward and hazy weather at 8 P.M. began to boil. Middle and Latter part fresh breeze and hazy at 7 P.M. stoped boiling blubber to Watering to boil good. Lowerd for Whales the Waist boat got fast and had to Cut one ship in sight So Ends
 Lat by Obs 39° 09' N Long 134° 02' East

Remarks on board Thursday May 11th
 These 24 hours Commences with fresh breeze from the S. and hazy weather Middle and Latter part fresh gale from the S.W. and hazy. Stowed Down 77 Bbls of Whale oil in the Fore hold So Ends
 Three Men sick of Duty
 Lat

in the Japan Sea in May 1848

Remarks on board Friday May 12th 1848
 These 24 hours Commences with a fresh gale from the S.W. and hazy weather Laying to under a Close reef Main Top sail. Middle part the same Latter part More Moderate employed in boiling and scraping bone saw right whales but too rugged to Lower the Boats So Ends Lat 39° 30' N Long 134° 10' East

Remarks on board Saturday May 13th
 These 24 hours Commences with a fresh gale from the S.W. and hazy weather Middle part Moderate Latter part fresh gale from the N.E. under short sail, employed in boiling and scraping bone So Ends Lat 39° 26' N Long 133° 58'

Remarks on board Sunday May 14th
 These 24 hours Commences with a fresh gale from the N.E. and thick weather Middle part the same Latter part moderate wind from the Eastward saw Nothing three Men sick of Duty So Ends
 Lat by Obs 39° 02' N Long 133° 41' East

Remarks on board Monday May 15th
 These 24 hours Moderate breezes and variables and hazy weather one ship in sight Chased Whales with out success So Ends Lat 39° 13'

Remarks on board Tuesday May 16th 1848
 These 24 hours Commences with Moderate weather at 8 P.M. Lowerd for whales got one to the Waist boat, Middle and Latter part pleasant, at 5 P.M. began to Cut, at 8 P.M. finished Cutting So Ends in Scraping bone
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
