Remarks on board Thursday August 17th
Then 24 hours Commences with a moderate breeze from the Northward with hazy weather, struck a whale to the Bow boat the Iron Draved out and Lost the Whale at 2 P.M. began to boil, Middle and Latter part fresh breeze from the Northward and Cloudy weather one Ship in sight, employed in boiling So Ends then 24 hours

Remarks on board Friday August 18th
Then 24 hours Commences with a fresh breeze from the Northward and Cloudy weather Chased whales with out success, Middle part moderate, Latter part strong breeze from the S.W. employed in boiling one Ship in sight So Ends
Lat 48° 40' N Long 147° 12' East

Remarks on board Saturday Aug 19th
Then 24 hours Commences with a fresh gale from the S.W. and Cloudy weather, under a close reef Main Top sail and Fore sail employed in boiling Middle and Latter part the same saw Two Ships So Ends then 24 hours
Lat 48° 55' N Long 147° 12' East

Remarks on board Sunday Aug 20th
Then 24 hours Commences with a strong breeze from the Southward and Cloudy weather, at 3 P.M. finished boiling Middle part more moderate Latter part moderate breeze from the Northward and pleasant Saw Nothing So Ends
Lat by Obs 49° 10' N Long 148° 44' E

in the Ochotsk Sea in August 1848

Remarks on board Monday August 21st 1848
Then 24 hours Commences with a moderate breeze from the Northward and pleasant, steering S.W. by S saw Nothing, Middle part moderate breeze from the Westward heading to the Northward Latter part fresh breeze from the Southward steering North saw Nothing, employed in stowing down oil in the After hold So Ends
Lat 49° 55' N Long 147° 50' East

Remarks on board Tuesday Aug 22^d 1848
Then 24 hours Commences with a strong breeze from the Southward heading to the Eastward under short sail Middle part moderate with fog Latter part the same heading to the Eastward, stowed down 30 Bbls of Whale oil in the Fore hold So Ends

Remarks on board Wednesday Aug 23^d
Then 24 hours Commences with a moderate breeze from the S.W. and foggy weather, Middle and Latter part strong breeze from the S.W. and thick weather heading to the Southward saw Nothing So Ends
Lat by Obs 48° 39' N Long

Remarks on board Thursday Aug 24th
Then 24 hours Commences with a fresh gale from the S.W. and thick weather heading S.E. Middle part more moderate Latter moderate breeze from the Eastward and hazy weather Two Ships in sight

Remarks on board Friday Aug 25th
Then 24 hours Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.E. and hazy weather Lower for whales the Larboard boat got fast and got stove, at 8 P.M. Turned the Whale
