

Remarks on board Ship Mechanic

Up about 10 miles to the windward of the Ship, hauled the whale and pulled for the Ship on the account of fog Middle and Latter part hazy weather beating to the windward saw Nothing of the Dead whale 3 ships in sight So Ends

Lat 48° 15' N

Remarks on board Saturday Aug 26th

Then 24 hours Commences with a fine breeze from the Northward and pleasant weather, employed in Repairing the stoven boat, and keeping a bright Look out for the Dead whale, at 6 P.M. Lowered the boats for a right whale, the Starboard got fast at 9 P.M. Cut from the whale to the windward of the ship the whale most Dead, Middle part pleasant Latter part the same, at 5 P.M. saw a Dead whale it Proved to be our whale, at 7 P.M. saw our second whale to the windward, sent one boat to the whale and commenced Cutting on the first So Ends

Remarks on board Sunday Aug 27th

Then 24 hours Commences with a fine breeze from the Northward and pleasant weather at 3 P.M. finished Cutting, made all sail and beat to the windward for the other whale at 5 P.M. took them along side, shortened sail and began to boil Middle and Latter part Moderate breeze and pleasant employed in Cutting and boiling So Ends

Lat by Obs 48° 10' N Long 149° 50' East

in the Schotsk Sea in August 1848.

Remarks on board Then 24 hours fine breeze from the S.W. employed in boiling, Laying with a whale along side Partly Cut in So Ends saw Nothing

Remarks on board Tuesday Aug 29th

Then 24 hours Light variable winds and pleasant employed in boiling, at 10 P.M. took in the Last of the whale, saw a French ship So Ends

Remarks on board Wednesday Aug 30th

Then 24 hours Moderate breeze from the N.E. and pleasant employed in boiling, at 10 P.M. commenced stowing down in Between Decks, saw Nothing So Ends

Remarks on board ~~Thursday~~ Thursday Aug 31st

Then 24 hours Commences with a Moderate breeze from the Eastward and pleasant Middle and Latter part the same, employed in boiling. Spoke the Ship Noctygama of New Bedford 12 months out 1000 Bbls of whale oil So Ends

Lat by Obs 48° 00' N Long 150° 07' East

Remarks on board Friday Aug Sep 1st

Then 24 hours Commences with a Moderate breeze from the Eastward and pleasant employed in boiling spoke the Ship Electra of New London 14 months out 1700 Bbls of whale oil, 8 ships in sight, at 6 P.M. finished boiling Middle part Strong breeze from the Southward Latter part Blowing heavy employed in Stowing down in the fore hold 2 ships in sight So Ends
