Remarks on board Saturday Sept 9<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commences with a fresh breeze from the Westward and Cloudy weather steering S by E under Short sail at 5 P.M. spoke the Ship Banditch of Warren, full bound in Port, Middle and Latter part Light breeze from the S.W. and pleasant steering to the Southward Lowered for whales with cut Tarsers, spoke Bark Pacific of Fair Haven four whales this Season So Ends

Lat by Obs 47° 22' N Long 150° 23' East

Remarks on board Sunday Sept 10<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commences with a fresh breeze from the Eastward and pleasant steering to the Southward bent a new main Top sail, four Ship in sight at sun set shortened sail, at 7 P.M. spoke the Ship Hintrags of New Bedford 1600 Bbls this season Middle part Light breeze from the N.E. and pleasant Latter part the same at Day Light saw the land keep off to the Southward for it under all sail at 9 A.M. Round Island bearing East, steering on the wind to the Southward Through Bussolles Straits at 12 M the Southernmost Island of the Lummocks bearing East Dist 5 miles Company Island bearing S by W Dist 18 miles So Ends

Remarks on board Monday Sept 11<sup>th</sup> 1848

These 24 hours commences with a Moderate breeze from the Eastward and Cloudy weather, heading on the wind to the Southward under all sail at 7 P.M. the Lummocks Island bearing Nth Dist 15 miles Company Island bearing bearing West Dist 15 miles Middle part fresh breeze at 1 A.M. Double reef the Top sails, at 6 A.M. Hauling heavy from E by E Close reef the Main Top sail and Fore sail So Ends with Thick weather

Lat 45° 12' N Long 150° 12' East

Remarks on board Tuesday Sept 12<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commences with a fresh gale from the S.E. and thick weather Laying too under a Close reef Main Top sail and reef Fore sail at 3 P.M. the wind hauled to the South wore ship heading E by E at 9 P.M. wind S.W. blowing a gale at 11 P.M. wind from the Westward blowing heavy steering E by S under a Close reef Main Top and reef Fore sail, at 10 A.M. shook one reef out of the Main Top sail and set the Fore sail So Ends steering E by E and S.E. saw nothing

Lat 44° 46' N Long 153° 00' East

Remarks on board Wednesday Sept 13<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commences <sup>with a fresh breeze</sup> from the Westward and pleasant steering E by E Middle part Moderate breeze from the Northward steering East Latter part Moderate breeze from the N.E. and pleasant heading to the Eastward bent New Fore and Mizzen Top sail saw nothing So Ends
