 These 24 hours fresh gales from the NW and squally weather and a heavy Sea running steering under a Close reef Main Top sail and Fore sail ESE and SE by E saw Nothing So Ends

 These 24 hours strong gale from the NW and squally weather heading SE by E under a Close reef Main Top sail and fore sail, Heavy Sea running looks of the Starboard boats Forward Taxis saw Nothing So Ends
