Remarks on board Friday Oct 6th 1848

These 24 hours Moderate breeze from the Westward and pleasant weather, steering S by E and ESE under all sail employed in Ships Duty. Saw Nothing So Ends, Jim Knacker Sick of Duty.

Remarks on board Saturday Oct 7th 1848

These 24 hours Commences with a Moderate breeze from the Westward and pleasant weather steering ESE under all sail Middle and Latter part Squally with rain, took in and and made sail according, steering SE by E and SE saw Nothing bent the Main Sparker So Ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Sunday Oct 8th 1848

These 24 hours Moderate wind and variables and Pleasant, heading to the Southward and Eastward Saw Nothing So Ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Monday Oct 9th

These 24 hours Moderate breeze and variables and Pleasant weather Working to the Southward under all sail, employed in Bundling Bone, Bundled 30. Bundles took the Sails out of the sail room and put the in Pipes put the Bone in the Sail Room took Down two Berths in the Stowage, Saw Nothing So Ends

Two Knackers and Two Sparrows Sick of Duty

Lat 31° 03' N Long 155° 35' West

Remarks on board Tuesday Oct 10th 1848

These 24 hours Commences with a Moderate breeze from the Southward and pleasant weather, heading to the Eastward Middle part Calm, Latter part Moderate breeze from the SW and pleasant heading SE by E employed in Drying and Bundling Bone. Saw Nothing So Ends, four Sick of Duty

Lat by Obs 30° 16' N Long 154° 43' West

Remarks on board Wednesday Oct 11th

These 24 hours Light air and variables and Pleasant Weather Working to the Southward under all sail saw a Brig steering to the Northward, employed in Drying and Bundling Bone So Ends

Lat by Obs 29° 42' N Long 153° 51' West

Remarks on board Thursday Oct 12th

These 24 hours Commences with a Light breeze from the Northward and pleasant steering SE by E under all sail Middle and Latter part Moderate from the Eastward and pleasant, heading to the Southward under all sail employed in Drying and Bundling Bone saw Nothing So Ends Two Sick of Duty

These 24 hours Commences with a Moderate breeze from the Eastward and pleasant Middle part fresh breeze took in Top gallant sails Latter part Squally Doubled reef the Top sails steering S by E, saw Nothing employed in Cleaning Bone So Ends
