Remarks on board Saturday Nov 4th 1848

Then 24 hours fine Pleasant weather employed in Calking Ship, at 1 P.M. took the Remains of Mr Reynold's on board the Ship Richmond to take him to Wahoo to be Buried, set the Colours Half mast and fired Minute Guns through out the Shipping from the time the boats left the Shore until they reached the Ship, one Watch on Liberty

Remarks on board Sunday Nov 5th 1848

Then 24 hours fine Pleasant weather, one Watch on Liberty

Remarks on board Monday Nov 6th

Then 24 hours fine Pleasant weather one Watch on Liberty Traded two Bbls whale oil for Fruit at 3 P.M. finished Calking Ship

Remarks on board Tuesday Nov 7th

Then 24 hours fine Pleasant weather got of a raft of water took out the Harbord Pump and repaired it,

Remarks on board Wednesday Nov 8th

Then 24 hours fine Pleasant, employed in Lumber got Sold 15 Bbls Beef to Barque Panthion of Fallriver, Discharged John Adams Seaman

Remarks on board Thursday Nov 9th

Then 24 hours fine Pleasant weather employed in Shipping our bone on board of the Barque Panthion of Fallriver for home, 217 Bundles weighing ~~11~~ Ninety Thousand one Hundred Sixty five Lbs took on board 20 Bbls of Irish Potatoes, the Capt Day the bone in in suiced to go soft for one and all concerned

Remarks on board Friday Nov 10th

Then 24 hours fine Pleasant weather employed in getting ready for Sea got of a small raft of water

Remarks on board Saturday Nov 11th

Then 24 hours Commences with a Light air from the Eastward and pleasant weather at 6 A.M. got Under Way at 8 A.M. the went on Shore. So Ends Laying off and on

Remarks on board Sunday Nov 12th ^{Day account}

Then 24 hours Commences with Light Variable winds Laying off and on at home at 3 P.M. the Captain came on board, and kept the Ship for Wahoo, Shipped a Carpenter, at 6 P.M. strong Trades from the NE doubled reef the Top sails starting for Wahoo, at 7 P.M. the Captain went on Shore at Wahoo So Ends Laying off and on
