Friday April 5th 1849

this day commences with moderate winds from the S & a thick weather middle part calm at 5 P M saw Cape Breton being 120
Saw 70 miles latter part winds from the S W beating up for
Bay of Islands do ends at 35.00 say 175.00

Remarks Saturday April 6th 1849

these 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the
S W beating up for Bay of Islands at 7 P M came to anchor
in 5 fathoms of water this day being Sunday at this part
let one watch go to shore do ends middle and latter parts
pleasant weather

Remarks Sunday April 7th 1849

this day light winds and pleasant weather employed in
cooping the between deck oil do ends

Remarks Monday April 8th 1849

this day light winds and pleasant employed in
cooping the between deck at 11 A M got finish and got
a raft of water do ends

Remarks Tuesday April 9th 1849

this day light winds and thick weather from the S W
one watch ashore on Liberty the watch on board employed
in cleaning ship do ends

Remarks Wednesday April 10th 1849

this day commences with thick weather and squally
from the south one watch on Liberty hand on
board employed in setting up shack track on board
1230 lbs of arms do ends with squally weather

Remarks Thursday April 11th 1849

this day one watch on shore land on board employed
in setting up shacks strong winds from the south

Remarks Friday April 12th 1849

this day fresh gales from the south one watch on shore
land on board employ in setting up pipe shacks

Remarks Saturday April 13th 1849

this day one watch on shore land on board employed in ship duty
do ends with pleasant weather

Sunday April 14th 1849

this commences with light winds and pleasant weather
one watch on shore

Remarks Monday April 15th 1849

this day one watch ashore watch on board employed
in cleaning ship do ends with rainy weather

Remarks Tuesday April 16th 1849

this day employed in getting of water and painting
ship do ends with pleasant weather

Remarks Wednesday April 17th 1849

this day employed in stowing down water and
painting ship do ends with pleasant weather

Remarks Thursday April 18th 1849

this day employed in getting of potatoes and wood
do ends with pleasant weather the annals was exchange

Remarks Friday April 19th 1849

this day one watch on shore employed in sundries
do ends with rainy weather Carpenter was discharge

Remarks Saturday April 20th 1849

this day one watch on shore Henry Rosenberg and
Joe Liluz was put in jail do ends with rainy weather

Remarks Sunday April 21th 1849

this day one watch on shore Lewis Barton P M Cole
& Summons and William Mory was put in jail
for getting drunk and not commencing on board at
sun set Turk Anderson and James Luke was discharged

Remarks Monday April 22th 1849

these 24 employed in getting the ship ready for sea & cumm
P Cole H Mory L Barton was taken out of jail and
sent on board Henry Rosenberg refuse to do any
more duty on board the ship

Remarks Tuesday April 23th 1849

this day Joe Liluz and Henry Rosenberg came on board
H Rosenberg came in ions and put in the run P Cole
and H Mory was turn faced and no more to
there about while on board this ship do ends
