winds from the South steering S by W saw 2 Barks
steering the same to Ench employed in skimming

Remarks Friday May 11th 1849
this 24 hours commences
with fresh winds from South middle part winds from
S & latter part strong winds from S by W steering
S by W one bark in sight to Ench with varying
weather Lat 16 22:35 long 176:32

Remarks Saturday May 12th 1849
there 24 hours commences with strong winds from the
S by W steering S by W middle part steering S by W at 5
P M saw 2 Barks and at Barks in sight
Lat part the same employed in repairing old sails
Lat 16 21:14 long 176:32

Remarks Sunday May 13th 1849
there 24 hours strong S & trades steering S by W
under 2 reefed sails to Ench saw nothing
Lat 16 19:28 long 176:32

Remarks Monday May 14th 1849
first part there 24 hours strong winds from S by W
middle part fresh gales from S & heading S by W
latter part the same to Ench employed in ship
surgery Lat 16 17:59 long 176:42

Remarks Tuesday May 15th 1849
first part there 24 hours strong winds from the S & C
heading S by W middle part more moderate latter part
winds from East steering S by W with all sail set
employed in repairing old sails to Ench
Lat 16 16:29 long 176:58

Remarks Wednesday May 16th 1849
there 24 hours moderate winds from the East steering
S by W with all sail set employed in repairing
old sails to Ench saw nothing
Lat 16 15:03 long 177:00

Thursday May 17th 1849
there 24 hours commences with moderate winds from
the East steering S by W at 3 P M saw 2 Barks
steering the same to Ench
Lat 16 14:20 long 177:00

Remarks Friday May 18th 1849
there 24 hours light winds and pleasant at 9 A M the mate
went on shore to trade for bags the Capt. stop on
board to Ench saying off and on at Home Island

Remarks Saturday May 19th 1849
this day light winds and pleasant weather heading
at Home Island got 60 bags and some yams and
beans and 4 boats loads of wood to Ench saying
of and on at Home Island

Remarks Sunday May 20th 1849
there 24 hours light winds and pleasant from S by E
steering S by E to Ench
Lat 16 13:31 long 177:40
the track at Home Island was 60 bags and pigs one ton of
yams 1200 coconuts 200 of goods with cost 5000 in trade

Remarks Monday May 21st 1849
this day commences with light winds from S by E heading
S by E and latter part calms employed in clearing
becks and fitting boats to Ench
Lat 16 13:12 long 177:30

Remarks Tuesday May 22nd 1849
there 24 hours commences with calms middle part light
winds from the South latter part the same steering North
employed in fitting the rigging to Ench
Lat 16 12:32 long 177:30

Remarks Wednesday May 23rd 1849
first part there 24 hours calms middle part light winds
from S by E heading S by E latter part winds from the
South steering North to Ench employed in ship duty
Lat 16 11:56 long 177:13

Remarks Thursday May 24th 1849
first part there 24 hours light winds from the South
steering S by E middle part calms latter part moderate
winds from S & C to Ench employed in ship duty
Lat 16 11:24 long 177:55
