

Remarks On Board Ship Mechanic
Tuesday Feb 26th 1850
this day commences with pleasant weather from
N.E. heading E.S.E. middle part winds from the North
steering E.S.E. latter part strong winds from N.W.
at 5 A.M. commences towing toward the Oil in the main
hatch to each side hatching lat 33.39 long 171.5 East

Remarks Wednesday Feb 27th 1850
this day commences with strong wind from the N.W.
middle part the same at 8 P.M. finish towing toward the
oil in the main hatch latter part strong winds from West
at 11 A.M. saw three things being land 40 miles
lat 34.04 long 171.53 East

Remarks Thursday Feb 28th 1850
this day commences with strong winds from the West
middle part calms latter part moderate winds from
the N.W. steering East one sail in sight to each
lat 33.50 long 172.53 East

Remarks Friday March 1st 1850
this day commences with moderate winds from the West
at 7 P.M. saw eleven whales but to day off to get to
them before sun set middle part strong winds from the
East latter part especially to each employed in ship duty
lat 33.33 south long 173.15 East

Remarks Saturday March 2nd 1850
first part strong winds from the East heading S.E.
middle part fresh gales latter part the same at 11 A.M.
saw New Zealand having south part 30 miles to each
lat 34.24 East long 174.54 East

Remarks Sunday March 3rd 1850
this day strong winds from the East at 3 P.M.
took up to the N.W. to each saw something
lat 33.39 south long 175.15 East

Remarks Monday March 4th 1850
this day commences with fresh gales from the East
middle part equally latter part the same heading
and different tack employed in ship duty
lat 33.62 south long 175.20 East

Remarks On Board Ship Mechanic ^{Tuesday March 5th}
this day fresh gales from N.E. heading S.E. to each
one sail in sight employed in ship duty
lat 35.01 south long 175.40 East

Remarks Wednesday March 5th 1850
this day strong gales and squally from N.E. heading
S.E. to each one sail in sight hatched employed in ship duty
lat 35.60 south long 175.40 East

Remarks Thursday March 7th 1850
this day commences with fresh gales from N.E. heading
S.E. middle part the same latter part more moderate
made sail to each hatched employed in ship duty
lat 35.37 south long 178.00 East

Remarks Friday March 8th 1850
this day commences with fresh winds from the N.E. heading
S.E. middle part winds from the N.W. heading East
latter part the same saw something hatched employed in ship duty
lat 37.08 south long 179.50 East

Remarks Saturday March 9th 1850
this day strong winds from N.W. heading East
to each saw something hatched employed in ship duty
lat 37.55 south long 176.41 East

Remarks Sunday ^{10th} in lat longitude
this day commences with strong winds from N.W. heading East
middle part more moderate latter part light winds and pleasant
weather to each saw something lat 38.24 south long 178.30 East

Remarks Monday March 11th 1850
first part from 8 hours moderate winds from N.W. heading East
the same latter part strong winds and squally from N.W. heading
East to each saw something lat 38.40 south long 174.60 East

Remarks Tuesday March 11th 1850
this day commences with fresh winds from the West
heading S.W. middle part equally latter part the
same to each saw to sail heading to the East
hatched employed in ship duty lat 38.43 south long 172.25

Remarks Wednesday March 12th 1850
this day strong winds from the West heading S.W. saw to each
employed in ship duty lat 38.60 south long 176.25
