this day commences with fresh gales from the N.E. heading N.W. & middle part calms with rain latter part moderate winds from N.E. heading N.W. 40 miles employed in ship duty
Lat 66 29.40 long 3 40m 10 59 West

Remarks Friday 29th 1850

this day commences with moderate winds from N.E. heading N.W. middle part calms latter part fresh gales from N.W. heading N.E. 40 miles employed in ship duty
Lat 66 29.18 South long 3 40m 10 59 West

Remarks Saturday March 30th 1850

this day commences with moderate winds from N.W. heading N.E. middle part strong winds from North steering South latter part fresh gales from N.W. heading N.E. 40 miles employed in ship duty
Lat 66 28.20 South long 3 40m 10 59 West

Remarks Sunday March 31st 1850

this day commences with fresh gales from N.W. heading N.E. middle part calms latter part moderate winds from N.W. heading N.E. 40 miles employed in ship duty
Lat 66 23.30 South long 3 40m 10 59 West

Remarks Monday April 1st 1850

this day commences with moderate winds from N.W. middle part the same latter part calms at 6 A.M. saw the land of Paratonga bearing N.E. 75 miles
40 miles employed in ship duty
Lat 66 21.49 South long 3 40m 10 59 West

Remarks Tuesday April 2nd 1850

this day moderate winds and pleasant weather from N.E. at 9 A.M. the Capt. went on shore to attend to the laying of and and at Paratonga

Remarks Wednesday April 3rd 1850

this day moderate winds from N.E. and pleasant weather get on board 60 lbs of water 20 lbs of greens 20 lbs of sweet potatoes and some fruit &c
saw a ship to the leeward heading N.W. 40 miles
Lat 66 21.09 South long 3 40m

Remarks on Board Ship Mechanic
Thursday April 4th 1850

this day commences with moderate winds and pleasant weather from N.E. at 3 P.M. the Capt. came on board and kept the ship up to the North at 6 P.M. spoke the ship of Kentucky Capt. Russell 9 months out. 25 lbs of sperm candle and latter part pleasant steering South
40 miles employed in ship duty
Lat 66 19.53 South long 3 40m

Remarks Friday April 5th 1850

this day commences with moderate winds and pleasant weather from North steering South at 10 A.M. saw the Island of Ikiyotaka bearing N.E. 25 at 4 P.M. the boat went on shore to trade for hogs at 11 A.M. the boat returned with 12 pigs and 30 ducks 40 miles with light winds from East steering North
Lat 66 15.13 long 3 40m 10 59 West

Remarks Saturday April 6th 1850

this day commences with moderate winds from the East steering North middle part strong winds from N.E. heading N.W. 40 miles latter part fresh gales from South heading N.W. at 6 P.M. saw sperm candle of the weather beam going very fast to the North did not draw the boat for them 40 miles
Lat 66 17.58 long 3 40m 10 59 West

Remarks Sunday April 7th 1850

this day commences with strong winds from North heading N.W. middle part moderate latter part moderate winds from N.E. heading N.W. 40 miles saw nothing
Lat 66 17.30 South long 3 40m 10 59 West

Remarks Monday April 8th 1850

this day winds from N.E. to North heading on different tracks working to the Northward 40 miles saw nothing employed in ship duty
Lat 66 17.18 South long 3 40m

Remarks Tuesday April 9th 1850

this day moderate winds from N.W. heading N.E. middle part the same latter part calms with rain employed in ship duty
Lat 66 17.00 long 3 40m
