

Remarks 1st Board Ship Mechanic
Thursday July 4th 1850

this day moderate winds and thick weather from
East at 11 A.M. the west boat prevented the drive
got foul and had to cut back the whale to East
with thick weather employed in looking 21 ships in sight
Lat 67° 14' long 172° 14'

Remarks Friday July 5th 1850

this day moderate winds and foggy weather at 10 A.M.
finish boring and commence throwing down in the
main hatch to East with very foggy weather saw plenty
of ice and now whales 10 ships
Lat 67° 30' long 174° 10' West

Remarks Saturday July 6th 1850

this day moderate winds from North heading and different tacks
at 9 A.M. finish throwing down 102 Bbls of Bone head oil
in the main hatch to East with foggy weather saw
21 ships and now whales plenty of ice
Lat 67° 40' long 174° 10' West

Remarks Sunday July 7th 1850

these 24 hours moderate winds from the North heading and
different tacks saw the land and plenty of ice 24 ships
in sight but lost the whale to East with all sail
Lat 67° 11' long 172° 22' West

Remarks Monday July 8th 1850

this day moderate winds from the East with a very thick
fog most of the time laying to back saw nothing
Lat 67° 20' long 172° 10' West

Remarks Tuesday July 9th 1850

this day moderate winds with thick fog middle part
the same later part fresh winds and pleasant weather
from East heading to the North to East 11 ships in sight
Lat 67° 30' long 171° 13'

Remarks Wednesday July 10th 1850

this day wind from North heading in different tacks
saw plenty of ice and 14 ships no whales
Lat 67° 30' long 171° 13'

Remarks Thursday July 11th 1850

this day strong winds and equally 10 ships in sight
Lat 67° 30' long 171° 13'

Remarks 1st Board Ship Mechanic
Friday July 12th 1850

this day strong winds and equally middle part
the same later moderate winds from North heading
to the East at 12 noon saw 7 whales to East 14 ships in sight
Lat 67° 29' long 172° 14'

Remarks Saturday July 13th 1850

this day commenced with moderate winds and pleasant weather
at 8 A.M. arrived the boats for whale at 2 the west boat put
at 9 A.M. took the whale to long side and commenced cutting
at 12 midnight finish cutting to East latter part
foggy employed in looking 27 ships in sight
and plenty of ice Lat 67° 35' long 172° 14'

Remarks Sunday July 14th 1850

this day moderate winds from North heading and
different tacks to East employed in looking 18 ships
in sight Lat 67° 21' long 172° 14'

Remarks Monday July 15th 1850

this day moderate winds from the East and very
foggy most of the time laying to back saw plenty
of ice and 14 ships to East employed in looking
Lat 67° 21' long 172° 14'

Remarks Tuesday July 16th 1850

this day moderate winds and foggy weather
heading in different tacks at 8 A.M. finish boring
at 9 A.M. commence throwing down in the main
hatch to East 17 ships in sight
Lat 67° 21' long 172° 14'

Remarks Wednesday July 17th 1850

this day moderate winds and pleasant weather
from SE heading in different tacks at 9 A.M.
finish throwing 70 Bbls of oil in the main hatch
to East 14 ships in sight no whales
Lat 67° 28' long 172° 14'

Remarks Thursday July 18th 1850

this day moderate winds from East heading to
the South to East saw 14 ships and the land but
no whales Lat 67° 19' long 170° 10'

Remarks Friday July 19th 1850

this day commenced with strong winds from East
middle part foggy later part strong winds and equally saw
plenty of ice and 14 ships no whales to East Lat 67° 01' long 171° 13'
