

Remarks On Board Ship Mechanic
Wednesday July 21st 1850
this day fresh gales from S E and thick weather
beading and difference taken low the land Baring S E
East 14 miles to End no whals 14 ships in sight
lat 66. 10 long 171. 30

Remarks Sunday July 21st 1850
this day fresh gales from S E heading and difference
taken most of the time foggy to End the land
in sight to the S E and 12 ships no whals
lat 66. 42 long 171. 50

Remarks Monday July 22nd 1850
first part this day fresh gales and thick weather from
S E heading on difference taken middle and later part very
foggy saw 2 whals to End with thick weather
lat 66. 07 long 172. 19

Remarks Tuesday July 23rd 1850
first part this day fresh winds from S E heading
on difference taken middle part the same later part
moderate winds from East heading S E at 9 AM we saw
a lead seal first took him & long dock and
cut him in and boiled him and he made 2
lbs of oil to End saw no whals one ship in sight
lat 66. 14 long 172. 40

Remarks Wednesday July 24th 1850
this day moderate winds from South heading on difference
taken to End with very foggy weather 2 ships in sight
lat 66. 05 long 172. 10

Remarks Thursday July 25th 1850
this day thick foggy weather from S E heading and
difference taken to End saw one ship
lat 66. 05 long 172. 10

Remarks Friday July 26th 1850
this day moderate winds from East heading South to End
with very thick weather saw 2 ships in sight
lat 66. 05 long 172. 10

Remarks Saturday July 27th 1850
first part this day moderate winds from S E and very
thick fog heading on difference taken middle part fresh
gales and rain from the East heading to the South
later more moderate with thick fog
to End one ship in sight
lat 66. 05 long 172. 10

Remarks On Board Ship Mechanic
Wednesday July 28th 1850
this day fresh gales and squally from the S E
and thick weather heading north to the South
to End saw 5 ships no whals
lat 66. 05 long 172. 10

Remarks Thursday July 29th 1850
this day fresh winds and thick foggy weather
from the East heading on difference taken to End
saw 2 whals and 11 ships low the land to the
South lat 66. 05 long 172. 10

Remarks Friday July 30th 1850
this day strong winds from the North and very
foggy weather most of the time saying 4 back to End
12 ships in sight 29 days seen whals 4 times
lat 66. 07 long 172. 10

Remarks Wednesday July 31st 1850
this day commenced with fresh winds from the North and thick
weather middle part the same later part moderate winds and very
foggy most of the time & saying 4 back to End saw nothing
lat 66. 05 long 172. 10

Remarks Thursday August 1st 1850
first part this day moderate winds and foggy weather middle
part the same at 7 AM ship of S E later part moderate
winds from North and thick weather to End this day
lat 66. 05 long 172. 10

Remarks Friday August 2nd 1850
first this day light winds and foggy from S E middle part the
same at 7 AM we saw the land Baring S E East 10 miles
later part clear weather saw 11 ships to End heading in
saw lat 66. 05 long 172. 10

Remarks Saturday August 3rd 1850
this day light winds and pleasant weather at 1 PM we took the anchor
in 23 fathoms of water to End the boats away evening
for whals Cape East Baring S E East 10 miles

Remarks Sunday August 4th 1850
this day moderate winds and pleasant weather saw no whals
to End this day

Remarks Monday August 5th 1850
first part this day moderate winds and pleasant weather
middle part the same later part fresh gales from the North
to End this day no whals saying at anchor
