Saturday Sept 7th 1850

This day light winds from the South heading on different tracks East
in sight and 6 ships saw no whales lat 46.34 long by chron

Remarks Sunday Sept 8th 1850

First part this day light winds from the South middle part calms latter part
fresh wind from the N.E. steering South this day part East side S.E. at noon
of St. Lawrence bay saw 2 ships at anchor
lat 46.27 long by chron 176.10 East

Remarks Monday Sept 9th 1850

this day strong gales and squally weather from the North steering S.W. & S
3 ships in sight 6 ends with heavy gales & rainy weather
lat 46.10 long by chron 173.10 East

Remarks Tuesday Sept 10th 1850

this day heavy rain from N.E. steering S.W. & S under 3 reef main & fore and
foremast to end with thick weather saw one ship
lat 46.10 long by chron 175.10 East

Remarks Wednesday Sept 11th 1850

this day heavy gales from the N.E. steering S.W. 360 under 3 reef main
foremast and foremast to end with thick weather one ship in sight
lat 46.10 long by chron 179.42 East

Remarks Thursday Sept 12th 1850

First part this day very gales from the N.E. steering S.W. & S middle
part the same latter part more moderate made all sail steering
S.W. one ship in sight 6 ends with clear weather employed in ship duty
lat 46.07 long by chron 177.49 58 R 177.30 East

Remarks Friday Sept 13th 1850

this day fresh wind from N.E. steering S.W. & S with all sail set
6 ends hands employed in ship duty one ship in sight
lat 46.17 long by chron 173.12 East

Remarks Saturday Sept 14th 1850

First part this day fresh wind and squally from N.E. steering
S.W. middle part the same latter part heavy gales steering S.W. & S
6 ends one ship in sight hands employed in ship duty
lat 46.14 long by chron 171.06 East

Remarks Sunday Sept 15th 1850

First part this day heavy gales from N.E. steering S.W. & S middle part
middle part more moderate latter part fresh wind from N.E. steering
South 6 ends saw 3 ships lat 46.19 long by chron 170.10 East

Remarks Monday Sept 16th 1850

this day moderate wind from the N.W. steering S.E. with all
sail set this day the foremast shuddering sail 6 ends
employed in ship duty lat 46.01 long by chron 172.15

Tuesday Sept 17th 1850

First part this day light winds from N.W. middle part calms latter
part light air from S.E. heading E.N.E. 6 ends one ship in sight
hands employed in ship duty lat 46.29 long by chron 173.20

Remarks Wednesday Sept 18th 1850

this day light winds from S.E. heading on opposite tracks to East
one ship in sight hands employed in ship duty
lat 46.14 long by chron 173.50 East

Remarks Thursday Sept 19th 1850

First part this day light winds from S.E. heading North S.W.
middle part calms latter part winds from N.E. steering S.E.
6 ends one ship in sight hands employed in ship duty
lat 46.05 long by chron 174.00 East

Remarks Friday Sept 20th 1850

this day moderate winds from N.W. steering S.E. with all sail
set 6 ends one ship in sight employed in ship duty
lat 46.45 long by chron 174.42 East

Remarks Saturday Sept 21st 1850

First part this day light winds from North steering S.E. & S middle
part calms latter part moderate winds from S.E. steering South
6 ends one ship employed in repairing the old main & foremast
lat 46.12 long by chron 176.14 East

Remarks Sunday Sept 22nd 1850

First part this day moderate winds from the S.E. heading South
middle part strong winds from S.E. heading E.N.E. latter part
fresh gales from S.E. heading E.S.E. with all sail set 6 ends
with thick weather lat 46.10 long by chron 178.00 East

Remarks Monday Sept 23rd 1850

First part this day strong gales and squally weather from S.E.
middle part more moderate latter part fresh wind from South
heading E.S.E. 6 ends employed in repairing sails
lat 46.23 long by chron 179.00 East

Remarks Tuesday Sept 24th 1850

First part this day fresh wind from the S.E. heading East middle
part the same latter part heavy gales blowing too much to
sail main & foremast 6 ends hands employed in ship duty
lat 46.41 long by chron 178.39 East

Remarks Wednesday Sept 25th 1850

First part this day heavy gales from South blowing too much to
sail at 4 P.M. the main & foremast the ship off E.S.E. under short
sails 6 ends employed in ship duty lat 46.52 long by chron 175.50
