Sunday Nov the 8th

All of these 24 hours strong winds from the N
A steering S by W all sail out gave a sea
beat by obs 21.01 S being by Chron 38.21 W.

Monday Nov the 9th 1846

All of these 24 hours strong from the NW
A steering S by W Brought in to the port of Santos
beat by obs 23.03 S being by Loomer 40.05 W.

Tuesday Nov the 10th

First part Brisk winds from N & steering
W by N Middle part moderate S to 12 S
The wind hauled round to S by S at daylight
tacked to the N by S under port cloudy weather
beat by obs 23.42 S being by S R 44.46 W

Wednesday Nov the 11th

First part strong winds and variable & the day
23 S in shore at 9 AM saw numerous light at 1
A bearing 70 by S Dist 15 miles Middle and
last part moderate the land all in sight
beat by obs 23.30 S being by Chron

Thursday Nov the 12th

All of these 24 hours light wind and calm & steering
to the N by W at 10 AM spoke bark sails and
brig chair of province town 4 months out no oil
beat by obs 23.37 being and in sight

Friday Nov the 13th

All of these 24 hours light wind from E & S
A steering W by W all sail out to end
beat by obs 24.08 S being and in sight

Satur Nov the 14th

First part A fine wind from S & steering
W by S Middle part hauled to under about sail
last part stood in for St. George Bay at 10 AM
came to anchor in Santos seeing the fort above
W by S Dist 40 of a mile this is a beautiful harbor
and sheltered from all winds and water
in a fine open vessel first came in to this
harbor they should not leave here ships or
a lone crew person to come on board till the vessel
is visited by the health officer or you will
have to come to pay so ends

All of these 24 hours fine weather 17 men on shore
got post in the Calabooz and the Capt
has 3 Colles to pay for each one of them so ends

Monday Nov the 16th

lying in harbor anchor imployed in watering and
ship

Tuesday Nov the 17th

Commencing with fine weather all hands imployed
in watering and painting the ship
at 11 AM ship
Charles Smith deserted from the

Wednesday Nov the 18th

All of these 24 hours fine weather imployed in ship
Duty on shore

Thursday the 19th

Still lying to anchor one watch on shore so ends

Friday Nov the 20th

First weather one watch on shore finished wooding and
watering and find we can get but few recruits here

Saturday Nov the 21st

Still lying to anchor and watch on shore
at 5 AM I stood about all night with out
leave at 10 AM took him on board after he
came on and the Capt took foot him in
boards for threat of murdering him on
board on 20 PM told that being on
board myself

Sunday Nov the 22^d 1846

First weather A lying to anchor imployed in getting off
Calabooz are so ends one kept on shore

Monday Nov the 23^d

fine weather imployed in getting ready for sea so ends
