Thursday May the 6th
fine weather employed in taking off wood and water

Friday May the 7th
employed in painting ship one watch on shore

Saturday May the 8th
fine weather & lying to anchor one watch on shore

Sunday May the 9th
First and Middle parts fine weather & lying to
Anchor later part at 4 Am took our anchor
and stood out to sea and steamed N.W.
Bound to St Thomas

Monday May the 10th
All of these 24 hours fresh trades and pleasant
& steering N.W. by W the island of St Kitts in
sight and full of sail with some other small
islands in sight Lat by obs 17:55 N Long 63:34 W

Tuesday May the 11th
fine weather At 7 Am came to anchor in St
Thomas harbor in 4 fathoms water so ends

Wednesday May the 12th
fine weather & lying to anchor employed in getting off
bread and some other articles from the shore

Thursday May the 13th
Commences with fine weather ship & our hands
and took them aboard At 7 Am took our and
stood out to sea so ends with fine weather &
steering N.W.

Friday May the 14th 1847
All of these 24 hours breeze from S & steering
N.W. all hands employed in getting the boats ready
Lat by obs 19:55 N Long by Chron 65:35

Saturday May the 15th
All of these 24 hours strong breeze from S & steering
N.W. by N all sail out so ends
Lat by obs 21:49 N Long by Chron 66:55

Sunday May the 16th 1847
These 24 hours strong breeze at times with squalls
of rain & steering N.W. by N under short sail
Lat by obs 23:05 N Long by Chron 67:10 W

Monday May the 17th
All of these 24 hours light winds and squally
& steering N.W. by W so ends with rain
Lat by obs 24:10 N Long by Chron 68:50 W

Tuesday May the 18th
These 24 hours light winds with squalls of rain
& steering N.W. by W so ends
Lat by obs 25:00 Long 69:10 W

Wednesday May the 19th
Light winds with squalls of rain wind
variable & steering N.W. by W At 7
Am saw a suspicious vessel with over
60 or 70 men on deck so ends
Lat by obs 26:00 N Long by Chron 69:45

Thursday May the 20th
First and middle parts light winds
later part the same employed in mending
sails Lat by obs 26:56 N Long 69:50 W
