First part strong winds from E N E A steering
W by N under a close reefed fore topsail and
fore sail Middle part much the same weather
At 11 PM took in the fore sail and topmast
and have to with her head to the E by S
Seater part more moderate At 6 PM left
of our course and made sail so ends
Sail by obs 34:58 N Long by Chron 57:42 W

Sunday Sept the 12th

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather
wind variable sent up the fore topgallant
yard Sail by obs 35:11 N Long by Chron 60:43 W

Monday Sept the 13th

First and middle parts light wind from N^W
by W A steering to the N by E Seater part
wind from E A steering N^W At 10 AM
speak the Brig Conception of Barcelona
Bound to Marseilles in Balise so ends
Sail by obs 35:23 N Long by Chron 61:28 W

Tuesday Sept the 14th

All these 24 hours moderate winds from S^W
A steering N^W all sail out so ends
Sail by obs 36:10 N Long by Chron 62:28 W

Wednesday Sept the 15th

First and middle parts of fine breeze from
N^W A steering N^W Seater part calm
Sail by obs 37:20 N Long 62:49 W

Thursday Sept the 16th

All these 24 hours light from N^W to E N E
A steering to the N^W all sail out so ends
Sail by obs 38:10 N Long by Chron 63:58 W

Friday Sept the 17th

There 24 hours light winds and squally A steering
N^W all sail out so ends
Sail by obs 37:28 N Long by Chron 64:00 W

Saturday Sept the 18th

All these 24 hours a strong wind from N^W
A steering N^W all sail out so ends
Sail by obs 38:59 N Long by Chron 67:04 W

Sunday Sept the 19th

All these 24 hours strong winds from N^W
A steering N^W by W all sail out so ends
Sail by obs 41:06 N Long by Chron 61:43 W

Monday Sept the 20th

First part strong winds from N^W
A steering N^W At 1 PM saw the island of
Nantucket A bearing N^W by E 16 miles we
find the vessel to the westward and are
obliged to keep off for the Vineyard sound
Middle part strong winds and heavy squalls of wind
and rain A beating up the sound for the cape
with all hands on deck Seater part strong
wind attended with hard rain At 7 PM could to
anchor in Tar-polen Cove in 12 fathoms water
wind N^W

Tuesday Sept the 21st

First and middle parts by to anchor in Tar-polen
cove Seater part more moderate At 9 AM
took our anchor and stood out through the sound

Wednesday Sept the 22nd

Slight winds from N^W to N^W at 8 AM passed the light
boat and haled up to by E N^W with a fair tide Middle
and Seater parts a strong wind from N^W by N^W
A beating up the cape so ends of Nantucket sight
