topgallant sail and reefed
main sail at 3 P.M. called
to in Provincetown
Fresh breezes from S.W.

Sunday Nov 16th 1847
This day commences with
fresh breezes from S.W.
lock in shore wood up
filled six casks with
wind still from S.W.

Remarks Wednesday 17th
This day begins with fresh
breezes from S.W. at 8 o'clock
lock in and stowed 24 casks
mackerel wood up
At 5 P.M. got under weigh
and proceeded to sea
Thousands this day
