

Remarks on board Monday June the 5th 1848 these 24 hours
beginning with fine breeze from N. & W. the Brig heading E. & E.
With all Barrels sail set for the island & then the
Wind hauled & we hoisted up the yards steering
E. & E. by the Wind 4 AM we saw a sail of our weather
Beam the Day for us And exchanged Signals with
us we got there Long about the last Part of this day
we saw a number of pinbacks so ends these 24 hours
with fine wind Lat 37° 30' N Long 74° 58' W.

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 6th 1848 these 24 hours
beginning with strong wind from the S. the Brig heading
E. & E. by the wind 5 AM Flores here by compass 13° by
dist 40 miles 11 AM we was up with it saw a Breeze
but could not retain what it was so ends this
day with fine breeze from the W. Lat 38° 57' N Long

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 7th 1848 these 24
hours beginning with fine wind and clear the Brig near
Flores all the first Part of these 24 hours fine wind from
the South the latter Part of these 24 hours strong breeze
and squalling the Brig of the west side of Flores saw a
sail at anchor so ends these 24 hours the Brig under
short sail the watch employed in ship duty

Remarks on board Thursday June the 8th 1848 these 24 hours
beginning with light wind from N. & W. 2 PM Flores here
at by 6 Dist 5 miles 2 PM we went on shore for
Recruits it being too late we could not find them 5 PM
the crew on board and in order to find
any Recruits the first chance 6 AM we was in close with
the Harbour we went on shore and got all that we
wanted and stood out steering E by the wind on a
course so ends this day with strong breeze from N. & W.

Remarks on board Friday June the 9th 1848 these 24 hours
beginning with strong breeze and cloudy the land in sight saw
Pigeons and saw fish the Brig heading W by 9 PM
we took up heading in fore course saw pinbacks so
ends this day with fine breeze from N. & W.

Remarks on board Saturday June the 10th 1848 these 24
hours beginning with strong wind and clear 2 PM we
saw a sail steering E. & E. 5 PM we took up steering
in for course one of the western islands all the first
Part of these 24 hours we had fine breeze the latter
Part light wind and clear saw two sail one whole Pack
one Merchant ship so ends this day with wind N. & W.

Lat 37° 35' N Long by Geo

Remarks on board Sunday June the 11th 1848 these 24 hours
beginning with light wind from N. & W. the Brig heading
all the first Part of these 24 hours we had light wind and
clear the latter Part strong breeze and cloudy the Brig
heading N. & E. saw pinbacks so ends this day Lat Long

Remarks on board Monday June the 12th 1848 these 24 hours
beginning with strong breeze from the South all the first
Part of these 24 hours we had strong breeze the latter Part
light wind attended with squalls of Rain so ends this day
Lat 39° 47' N Long 32° 40' W.

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 13th 1848 these 24
hours beginning with light wind from N. & W. the Brig heading
all the first Part of these 24 hours we had strong breeze the
latter Part light wind and cloudy attended with some Rain
the Brig heading N. & E. so ends this day Lat 40° 30' N Long 32° 00'

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 14th 1848 these 24
hours beginning with strong wind and cloudy
1 PM we saw Ship steering S. with all sail set 9 PM took
in sail 4 AM we saw Blackfish and
got past the iron barge out and the first Part of 17 AM we
on board so ends this day with fine breeze and clear

Remarks on board Thursday June the 15th 1848 these 24
hours beginning with fine breeze the Brig heading
N. & E. with all sail set 7 PM we took in sail heading E. & E.
made sail square in the yards steering S. saw two Birds of
our weather and also juncos flies in sight dist 30 miles
so ends this day with light wind and clear Lat Long

Remarks on board Friday June the 16th 1848 these 24
hours beginning with light wind from the E. the Brig heading
South all the first Part of these 24 hours we had light
breeze and clear the latter Part light wind and cloudy
saw Blackfish we found caught two Flores here by compass
N. & E. dist 40 miles so ends this day with light wind

Remarks on board Saturday June the 17th 1848 these
24 hours beginning with light wind from the N. & W. the
Brig heading E. for the land 2 PM we saw the Belloirle of
Pernambuco 2 months out 100 Barrels Spinn oil 6 PM
Flores here by compass dist 6 miles the first Part of
this day we had light breeze the latter Part strong
wind from the S. the Brig made the E. side of Flores
so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Sunday June the 18th 1848 these 24
hours beginning with strong wind and cloudy from
the S. 3 PM took one Reef in the fore topmast saw a Ship
bore all these 24 hours we had strong breeze from the S.
the latter Part from the W. attended with squalls of
Rain the Brig close by course so ends this day
