

Remarks on board Monday June the 19th 1848 these 24 hours begins with thick Breeze weather 2 PM we Shortened Sail steering S the middle and latter Part of these 24 hours we had light breeze from the West the Brig running down by the island of Flores we saw two Brigs steering in shore so ends this day

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 20th 1848 these 24 hours begins with strong breeze and cloudy all the first Part of these 24 hours the latter Part squally weather we saw a number of ships and Brigs in shore of Sunday Cruise so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 21st 1848 this day begins with thick Breeze weather and ends the same we was in sight of the island the fore of these 24 hours saw a number of ships and Brigs in shore

Remarks on board Thursday June the 22nd 1848 these 24 hours begins with windy weather Flores in sight 10 PM blowing hard Wind N E 6 AM the same attended with some Rain the latter Part of these 24 hours quite Moderate the Brig on the W side of Flores so ends this day

Remarks on board Friday June the 23rd 1848 these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from S E the middle Part of this day light breeze and cloudy the latter Part strong breeze and clear the Brig near the island of Flores we saw a number of ships lying off and on Recruiting Ship so ends this day

Remarks on board Saturday June the 24th 1848 these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the W the Brig heading in shore we saw Jimbuck the latter Part of these 24 hours blowing hard from S W the Brig heading in for Flores we saw a Merchant ship steering to Shoal Callers so ends this day

Remarks on board Sunday June the 25th 1848 these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from S W the Brig under the east side of Flores the middle and latter Part of this day we had clear weather the Wind E we saw an English ship of Flores the Mate came on board to visit the vessel so ends this day with fine wind from the East

Remarks on board Monday June the 26th 1848 these 24 hours begins with fine breeze from the E the Brig heading in for Flores the middle and latter Part of these 24 hours we had light breezes from the E saw a ship of Flores so ends these 24 hours the Brig of course

Remarks on board Tuesday June the 27th 1848 these 24 hours begins with strong breeze and cloudy the middle and latter Part of these 24 hours we had light breezes from the E the Brig heading S by W saw a ship steering in for Flores so ends this day Flores in sight

Remarks on board Wednesday June the 28th 1848 these 24 hours begins with light wind and clear from the E the Brig heading S by W with all sail set 2 PM we saw Jimbuck ahead the middle and latter Part of these 24 hours we had calm weather saw two ships on the E side of Flores so ends this day Flores 15 miles dist

Remarks on board Thursday June the 29th 1848 these 24 hours begins with light wind from the S the Brig heading in for course saw Porpoises and basifish 5 PM we found our boats to encircle the line the ship Daniel Webster of Nantucket was in sight three boats was in charge of us there was 37 days out clear round a round the flower the middle and latter Part of this day we had calm weather and killed so ends this day

Remarks on board Friday June the 30th 1848 this day begins with calm weather 1 PM we sent our fore sail down to repair it 4 PM sent it 6 PM found our boats to encircle the line the middle and latter Part of these 24 hours we had fine breeze from the E we saw 8 sail standing in shore the latter Part of this day we were cruising of Flores and barro so ends this day

Remarks on board Saturday July the 1st 1848 these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from the S the Brig heading of Shore 6 PM tagged ship heading in Flores 4 of 6 tagged steering E saw two ships one for sail schooner so ends these 24 hours with strong wind from the S

Remarks on board Sunday July the 2nd 1848 these 24 hours begins with strong wind from S W attended with squalls of Rain 2 PM fine weather the Brig heading in for Flores the middle and latter Part of these 24 hours we had strong wind from S W the Brig heading in for Flores saw a number of ships and Brigs so ends this day

Remarks on board Monday July the 3rd 1848 these 24 hours begins with strong wind from S W 1 PM Shortened Sail the Brig heading in for Flores all the first Part of these 24 hours we had strong breeze from S W the latter Part light breeze attended with squalls of Rain saw two sail in shore so ends this day with light wind 11 miles dist all the first Part of these 24 hours we had strong breeze from S W the latter Part moderate breeze from S W the Brig heading E of shore so ends these 24 hours with fine weather the crew employed in ships duty
